

FEES

The Phonographic Performance Company of Australia Ltd (PPCA) is a non-profit organisation that provides licences to Australian entities to play recorded music in public. Our Eisteddfod is responsible for payment of relevant fees as prescribed by PPCA and for payment of other relevant fees prescribed by other Copyright Councils. The net fees are distributed to record labels & registered Australian artists who create the recordings so they can continue to make music for us all to enjoy. A portion of each of your Eisteddfod entry fees goes to covering these costs.

CHANGES FOR 2021

Regrettably, due in the main to our inability to attract sufficient interest in filling the role of convenor, neither Dance Division nor Piano Division will operate in 2021.

There are other changes for 2021 throughout this Syllabus. If you've been with us before, make sure you check to see if anything has changed in your chosen Section(s).

HOW TO ENTER

- 1. Read the rules and any accompanying correspondence.
- 2. Consult your teacher.
- Choose your preferred method of entry; on-line or postal: A - ON-LINE ** not available for Creative Writing Division ** Register on-line by following these instructions:
 - Go to www.comps-online.com.au
 - Click the *LOGIN* button next to the competition name.
 - If you already have an account with Comps-Online, just login. Otherwise, select *Click Here to Create a New Account*. Once you have filled in your details, you will be emailed a confirmation document that activates your account. Then you can simply log back in and follow the steps to complete all of your entries.
 - Proceed to the **Payments Page Step 5** to review your entry summary and click to accept the terms and conditions of the competition (compulsory). Payment must be by **PayPal** or **Credit Card**. Once you click submit under this option, you will be transferred directly to PayPal where you can choose to pay with credit card or with a PayPal account. Entries will only be accepted once full payment has been received.
 - An invoice will be emailed to you confirming that your registration has been received. If you do not receive an invoice within 1 hour in your Inbox or in your Junk Mail folder, contact Comps-Online Technical Support on (03) 9841 5940.
 - If you are entering either of School Choirs or School Bands, you will need to provide additional information to the convenor:
 - Download from our website and complete the appropriate On-Line Entry Additional Information Form(s).
 - $\circ\;$ Post or email your On-Line Entry Additional Information Form(s) to the Division Convenor.
 - **B** POSTAL
 - Download from our website and complete the appropriate Entry Form(s).
 - Post your completed Entry Form(s) with the appropriate entry fee(s) to reach the Division Convenor before the nominated Postal Entry closing date and time. Email entries will not be accepted. Payment must be by cheque or Money Order made payable to *Muswellbrook & Upper Hunter Eisteddfod Inc.* If you are entering the Creative Writing Division, include your composition with your entry.
- 4. Once your entry has been processed, competitor tickets will be sent to you with a program and an AMCOS declaration (if deemed required by the convenor).

COVID-19

At the time of publication, uncertainty remains regarding regulations and controls that might or might not be in place at various times during 2021 to manage the COVID-19 pandemic. The Eisteddfod will implement whatever changes are deemed necessary for the safety of our members, our volunteers and our competitors.

DEFINITIONS

Division – Each of the components of the Eisteddfod. Examples include Vocal and Creative Writing

Section - a numerically identified category within a Division.

GENERAL RULES AND GUIDELINES

General

- 1. All entries must be via the prescribed entry process. For all Duos/Trios entry details must include all names.
- 2. Competitors are encouraged to enter into the most appropriate age group that their skill level will allow.
- 3. Open Age Sections are open to competitors of any age.
- Responsibility for correct entry rests with the entrant. Competitors WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM unless all monies due are paid.
- 5. Personal details provided by the entrant are for the Eisteddfod's use only.
- 6. No refunds will be made after an entry has been accepted. However, for Sections cancelled, a refund may be made at the discretion of the Eisteddfod Committee.
- 7. Sections not appearing in the program have been cancelled.
- 8. Late entries will be accepted only with the prior agreement of the Convenor. Late entries are subject to final timetabling capacity and program deadlines without obligation. Late entries must be accompanied by a late fee of \$5 per Section. If accepted, late entries might not appear in the program.
- 9. Competitor's ticket and program will be delivered/emailed by the Division Convenor prior to the Eisteddfod. Competitors must complete details and bring them to hand to the Convenor on the day of their performance.
- 10. In all Divisions a copy of the music or text must be handed to the Convenor at the beginning of the session. This copy is for the Adjudicator's use; except for Vocal Sections, where provision of music is optional for contemporary Sections.
- 11. Instrumental, Pipe Ogran & Vocal competitors should bring original music.

- 12. The Adjudicator's Copy of song or text must be a clean and legible single sheet photocopy and clearly numbered. The Eisteddfod Committee is obliged to retain and then destroy this photocopy.
- 13. Any song may be transposed to a key suitable to the vocalist unless otherwise specified.
- 14. This competition is open to amateurs only. An amateur is one whose regular income is not derived from the performance of his or her talents in the Division entered. Teachers are permitted to enter except in the Choir and Band Sections which are designed for school students only.
- 15. Competitors must be prepared to provide proof of age.
- 16. The Eisteddfod reserves the right to amend or refuse any entry, to disqualify or deny participation, to alter or reduce the prizes as published or to amend, cancel or combine any event.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to vary the program at any time.
- 18. The Committee reserves the right to vary any rule where such variation is deemed necessary.
- 19. In Own Choice Sections the quality of the selection will be taken into account.
- 20. In Championships, selection of material should reflect the diversity and skill of the competitor, showcasing the competitor's ability.
- 21. Within a Division, a competitor (individual or group) MAY NOT present a prepared piece in this year's Eisteddfod if that same competitor presented that same prepared piece in the previous year's Eisteddfod. This rule applies irrespective of the Section in which the piece was or is presented.
- 22. Restricted Sections are for competitors who have not won a 1st Prize in any Eisteddfod, irrespective of age, in the same Division within the two-year period prior to the date of performance in this Eisteddfod.

Lost Property

23. Unidentified lost property will be held for two months.

Photography & Recording Prohibited

24. Unless authorised by Eisteddfod personnel, the use of cameras and recording devices, including mobile phone cameras, is prohibited during performances because of Copyright restrictions and privacy laws.

Prizes

- 25. In all Divisions, a Section must include a minimum of three (3) competitors for prize money to be awarded. This does not apply to Championship Sections.
- 26. In general, a trophy or a medal together with a certificate will be awarded for 1st Place in all Sections, with 2nd and 3rd Place and Highly Commended also being awarded a certificate. Monetary awards are offered for some Sections as set out in the Syllabus.
- 27. Perpetual Trophies remain in the custody of the Eisteddfod.
- 28. Any competitor performing in a Section not in accordance with the category will not be eligible for a prize and will forfeit the entry fee for that Section.

Performance

- 29. Entrants and competitors must be aware of the rules of copyright.
- 30. 15 minutes prior to commencement of the session, competitors must have handed the following to the convenor:
 - <u>completed</u> competitor tickets
 - AMCOS/copyright declaration forms
 - music for participant (original), music for adjudicator (copy), and music for accompanist if required (copy)
- 31. Competitors must be ready to perform when called upon, with speech and in costume as appropriate, or will forfeit their right to compete.
- 32. Competitors wishing to withdraw are reminded that it is professional courtesy to inform the Convenor before the first day of the Division, or before the commencement of the session.
- 33. No competitor may rehearse in the adjudication space during the period of the relevant Division.
- 34. Vocal, and Speech & Drama competitors are to introduce the piece they are performing.
- 35. Competitors should be aware that their standard of dress is important.
- 36. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Convenor/Stage Manager and be in the correct position for the start of each Section.
- 37. The Convenor will determine the order in which competitors perform.
- 38. Competitors should expect each session to run for approximately three (3) hours and are to make themselves available for the duration of the session.

- 39. Any competitor who suffers memory lapse or otherwise stops during the performance, will forfeit the competition unless remaining on stage and completing the performance within the time limit, which may include continuing unaccompanied.
- 40. A competitor may not perform the same item in more than one Section in the same Division; except for Speech & Drama Secondary student/s who are invited to perform the same piece in the Open Age Sections.
- 41. In Instrumental Ensemble Sections and group Vocal Sections, competitors may enter the same Section more than once but not with the same combination of competitors.
- 42. All competitors within a Section must perform within the allotted time slot. A competitor will be eligible for 'adjudication only' if they cannot compete at the same time as other competitors.
- 43. For timed Sections, the clock starts with the first note, dance step, action or word and ends with the last note, dance step, action or word. Bows with music are timed.
- 44. In all Sections of all Divisions, **coaching** is not permitted and, if detected, may result in disqualification.

Accompaniment

- 45. Should any competitor's accompanist fail to appear when the time is announced the competitor may forfeit the right to compete.
- 46. The accompaniment must be printed on the same page as the solo instrumental or vocal part for the adjudicator.
- 47. If the Official Accompanist (Vocal Division) is required, this must be advised to the Convenor.
- 48. Where the Official Accompanist (Vocal Division) is required it is the responsibility of the competitor to make contact and supply music a minimum of 14 days before the performance date. Any cost associated with rehearsals with the Official Accompanist is the responsibility of the competitor.
- 49. Unless the chosen piece is composed as an unaccompanied work, competitors in Instrumental and Vocal Divisions must have piano accompaniment or a single instrument.
- 50. Only an accompanist, conductor or competitor is allowed on the stage during a performance.

Adjudication

51. The Adjudicator's decision is final in accordance with the rules.

- 52. Competitors, teachers and parents must not approach the Adjudicator during the period of the competition.
- 53. Should the Adjudicator be unable to perform his or her duties the Committee may appoint a substitute.
- 54. Competitors who have been pupils of an Adjudicator at any time during the six (6) months preceding the Eisteddfod shall not be eligible to compete in any Section judged by that Adjudicator.
- 55. The number of certificates awarded in any Section will be at the discretion of the Committee or the Adjudicator.
- 56. The Committee reserves the right for the Adjudicator to withhold or reduce any prize where, in the Adjudicator's opinion, an adequate standard has not been attained.
- 57. The choice of suitable material rests with the competitor. Foul or coarse language or explicit sexual references or questionable material likely to cause offence are prohibited. The Convenor must be told, at the time of entering of any scripted material that is likely to cause offence (e.g. an HSC piece) so audience members can be warned, and disclaimers placed in the program. Failure to do these things may lead to disqualification.

Backing Tracks

- 58. Competitors should carry two copies of backing tracks in case one malfunctions. Backing tracks can be used in:
 - Contemporary Vocal Sections
 - 20th/21st Century Composer Instrumental Sections
 - Instrumental Sections where specified only
 - All Choirs & Bands Sections
 - All Dance Sections

The Committee takes no responsibility for recordings that do not operate. Except for Dance Division, it is the competitor's responsibility to operate or provide a person to operate the equipment.

- 59. Competitors may perform to a professional backing tape which may contain backing vocals only i.e. no principal/vocal is allowed on the backing tape. Any deviation from this rule will result in an Adjudication only report.
- 60. Backing tracks may be on cassette tape, CD or in MP3 format. The provided PA system has facilities for tape, CD and has a USB port that can play MP3 format. Competitors must supply a cable to their media. Competitors are responsible for the compatibility of the equipment.

- 61. Only one song per CD, clearly marked with the competitor's name, and number using an appropriate pen. Do not use sticky labels as they may impair the running of the CD. It is the responsibility of the competitor to organise the above.
- 62. All CDs must be submitted in a clear protective case (clearly marked with the competitor's name).
- 63. If the track is prepared on a home computer, ensure that it has been 'finished'. Check that it plays through a normal audio system.
- 64. Should you think that any music on any part of the track may be mistaken for 'lead vocals' then you should contact the Convenor prior to the event. Dancers should refer to Division rules in this regard.
- 65. Suggestions for sourcing Vocal backing tracks can be found at backingtracks.com.au.

Limitation of Entries

66. For reasons of scheduling constraints, the number of entries accepted for a particular Division may have to be limited.

Order of Performance

67. The order in which Sections appear in this Syllabus is not necessarily the order in which performances will occur. The order of performance will be structured by the convenion to the best convenience of the majority of competitors.

DIVISION RULES

These rules must be read in conjunction with the General Rules and Guidelines.

- 1. The Eisteddfod Committee provides an accompanist for performance. Arrangement of any rehearsal with that accompanist is the competitor's responsibility as are any costs or fees associated therewith. Competitors should contact by email & supply music to the official accompanist at least 14 days before performance. Competitors may use an alternate accompanist at their own expense.
- 2. The Committee may provide a piano, microphone, amplifier, speaker, CD player and facilities for MP3 format. Please note competitors must provide USB cord to connect to their media.
- **3.** Competitors will need to provide someone to assist cueing music if using backing tracks.
- 4. Song selections must meet the description requirements of the Section (i.e. folk songs cannot be from musical theatre). Competitors who fail to comply with this rule will receive an "adjudication only" report.
- 5. For all vocal Sections part of the performance is the ability to remember the lyrics. No words or stands with music are permitted for any performance (other than oratorio). Competitors who fail to comply with this rule will receive an "adjudication only" report.

DIVISION DEFINITIONS

Own Choice

A song from any of the Character / Musical Theatre, Folk Song or Sacred Song classical styles. Competitors will be judged on song selection.

Character / Musical Theatre

Any song from a musical production or movie (G-rated), sung in the original form. Costume is to be worn and will form part of adjudication. Minimal props are to be used. In addition to announcing the song, the competitor is to announce the name of the show and the composer prior to performance.

Folk Song

A song (words and music) which has been handed down from generation to generation, and for which there is no known composer. Such songs are usually marked "traditional" or "traditional folk song" or may be a national song from any country. May be sung in English or in the original language. There is a growing repertoire of songs in the folk song style that are titled "folk" or "country and western" in the popular music field that would not fit into this category. May be accompanied by piano, by solo acoustic instrument or unaccompanied.

Sacred Song

Any song of liturgical or religious intent, including hymn, classical sacred song, contemporary Christian song or ballad.

Australian Song

A classical song by an Australian composer, or an Australian folk song, or a song about Australia, or a song written by or for an Australian performer. These sections are not for Musical Theatre.

Walt Disney

A Disney song selected from a Disney production, either from stage, film or TV, but NOT Disney TV shows. Backing vocals are not permitted on the backing tracks. In addition to announcing the song, the competitor is to announce the name of the production prior to performance.

Popular Song

A contemporary song from any of the modern genres including pop, jazz, blues, film, rock or country. Popular Song does not include Walt Disney or rap.

Jazz/Blues

Music that combines jazz & blues styles of strong rhythmical beat, use of blues notes and swing rhythms, improvisation and frequent use of syncopation. Jazz / Blues does not include rap.

Italian Song or Aria

Any 16th, 17th or 18th Century Italian Song or Aria. For example, any song from "28 Italian Songs and Arias".

Lieder

A vocal composition from the Romantic German movement of late 18th/19th Century, preferably sung in original language. Equal importance should be given to singing, text and accompaniment.

VOCAL GENERAL SECTIONS

For all sections, competitors need to announce the song each time they sing. This helps prepare the voice for singing.

For classical sections, competitors must use an accompanist or sing a cappella for folk songs. Competitors must not use microphone or backing tracks and must not self-accompany. This option is offered in popular sections.

For popular sections, competitors can use microphone, backing track (without backing vocals), accompanist or may self-accompany.

VOCAL CHAMPIONSHIP SECTIONS

For Junior Championships, a competitor must enter, and compete to the Adjudicator's satisfaction, in at least two (2) Vocal Division solo Sections to be eligible for the Championship Section. Compeitors must perform two (2) contrasting songs from the following genres Musical Thearte, Folk,Sacred, Australian Song, Walt Disney, Popular Song, Jazz/Blues. Items performed during Vocla Division solo Sections must not be repeated in Championships.

For Senior Championships, a competitor must enter, and compete to the Adjudicator's satisfaction, in at least two (2) Vocal Division solo Sections prior to the Championship Section. In the Championship Section, the competitor must sing two (2) contrasting songs, one in foreign language, from the following categories - Oratorio, Sacred Song, Folk Song, Musical Theatre, Lieder, Australian Song. The Championship pieces should reflect diversity & skill. Items performed during Vocal Division solo Sections must not be repeated in Championships.

VOCAL GROUP SECTIONS

Group performances do not count toward Championships. Song choice in group Sections can be contemporary or classical. All performances are non-amplified.

Duo / Trio - Junior (14 years and under) Section No. 977, 1st Prize: \$40

Duo / Trio - Open (15 years and over) Section No. 978, 1st Prize: \$40

Competitors must sing one (1) song of own choice. The song can be of Classical or Contemporary style. Music for adjudicator must be provided for Contemporary choices. Arrangements must have 50% harmony, not just question and answer. Competitors can self-accompany, use backing track or piano accompaniment.

Mixed Church or Community Choir Section No. 979, 1st Prize: \$50
