Venue – Pennant Hills Community Centre

Pennant Hills Community Centre is attached to the Library, opposite the station & shops at Pennant Hills. The Main Hall is upstairs. The stage is traditional wooden floor 12m x 9m. This venue DOES NOT have tarkett. EEE will provide resin for dancers. Both Male & Female toilets are in the foyer. All dancers MUST come dressed with hair & make up done. A small dressing room backstage is available quick changes. Pete's mobile coffees will be running a canteen throughout this event.

Championships

Those entered in Championships, will only perform their new non repeat dance in the Championship sections & all other routines that Championship dancers are entered in at EEE will be included in results. Adjudicators are aware of the dancers who have entered Championships at EEE as its is noted on their spreadsheet.

Improvisations

Improvisation dancers will receive notification via email by 5pm on Friday for their Improvisation song. Please listen to the song choice prior to competition day & be prepared as dancers will NOT re-listen to the song on competition day. Improvisation is 1 min and will be any part of the song. Dancers do not need a costume for Impro.

Competition

A competition is a situation in which two or more people or groups are trying to get something which not everyone can have. A competition is more than just one person, its 2 or more. A competition is an activity or condition of striving to gain or win something by defeating or establishing superiority over others. Please understand that EEE is running a competition, hence why there are combined variety sections in the program. This is to ensure that dancers are competing against another person in a competition environment.

Presentations

Miss Rachael will constantly announce results throughout the event & there are EEE 1st, 2nd, 3rd & HC Banners at the venues, where dancers can take photos.
