It is **YOUR** responsibility to check your entry before submitting and paying. There will be no corrections to entries, refunds or changing of sections once entries are closed. Make sure all details are correct, including your name, age, sections entered, etc.

The Mackay Eisteddfod Association does <u>NOT</u> review your entry - the onus is on the competitor to ensure that their entry is correct.

We welcome donations for Trophies and Prize Money. Without these generous donations, our event would not go ahead. Payment can be made with your Comps Online entry or by bank deposit, EFTPOS or cash at the Mackay Eisteddfod Office.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

It is the responsibility of all entrants to check individual art forms for specific rules and regulations that apply in addition to these general conditions.

- This competition is open to amateurs only. The term 'amateur' is defined as one whose principal source of income is not derived from performing that talent required for any section entered. This condition does not apply to conductors or accompanists.
- In all sections listed where an age limit applies, the age of the competitor as at 1st January 2025 shall be considered the age of the competitor (except Highland Dancing where the age is taken as at the date of the competition).
- All entries for Duets/Duos/Trios/Quartets should contain the names and birth dates of all competitors or the entries will not be accepted. (Except Vocal Sections 66 & 68). For Duets/Duos and Trios all competitors must be the age specified.
- A No solo competitor will be allowed to compete under any name other than that entered online. It is the Entrants' responsibility to check their Comps Online invoice for accuracy as no changes will be accepted after entries close 7th May. In the case of a Duet/Duo/Trio/Quartet, if there is a good reason, then at the discretion of the committee, a new partner may be substituted. Applications for substitutions must be received by 10th July (before the program is published). Applications received after this date may be granted, but the competitors will not be eligible for a mark or placing.
- In solo sections, to be eligible to compete in a higher or open age group section the competitor must compete in the same section in his/her own age group (if applicable). Where an age group is specified, only competitors of that age will be eligible to compete.
- 6 Competitors may only have one entry per section. This also applies to competitors entering groups, duets, duos and trios, quartets unless otherwise specified in the schedule.
- Please ensure that your correct details are entered (name, age, sections entered, email address/postal address, contact phone number, section to sponsor etc.) including Section sponsorships/Trophy donations if applicable, as the Comps Online invoice you receive after payment is your Confirmation of Entry and no corrections will be allowed after entries close.

- 8 Entrants must appear in their section in program order, or forfeit their right to perform, except when clashes between art forms occur and prior arrangement has been made with a committee member at the Eisteddfod Office. Competitors will not be allowed to change to another sub-section where sections have been split into A and B, etc.
- **9** Competitors who do not intend to compete in a section for which they have entered should notify the Eisteddfod Office before the time appointed for that section.
- No teacher or parent will be allowed on stage during a performance unless they are an accompanist or conductor.
- An Adjudication critique will be provided (except in Highland and Irish Dancing sections). Depending on art form, these will be available as an audio critique (via Music Uploads) OR as a hard copy (from the Eisteddfod Office).
- No prompting will be permitted in any sections, if prompted, competitors will face disqualification. No unauthorized person is allowed to stand in the wings during a performance.
- Communication with Adjudicators is strictly prohibited. If it is established that any competitor or unauthorised person has been in contact with an Adjudicator during the course of the Eisteddfod, the Committee reserves the right to disqualify that competitor.
- 14 Competitors must not have had any tuition from any of the Adjudicators for a period of six months prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod.
- Competitors may face disqualification if they do not adhere to time limits set out for various sections. In sections where a time limit is specified, the ringing of a bell will indicate that the time limit has been exceeded, and the competitor must cease to perform.
- The same item (or part thereof) must not be performed more than once by the same competitor throughout the duration of the Eisteddfod (excluding Highland and Irish Dancing).
- The results of each respective aggregate trophy winner shall be determined by a points system. For each section, First place will receive 10 points; Second 7 points; Third 5 points; Fourth 3 points; Fifth 2 points; Sixth 1 point. Exceptions:
 - 1) In Primary and Secondary Choral Choir Championships the Adjudicator's actual marks will be totalled.
 - 2) In Highland Dancing sections, the R.S.O.B.H.D. scrutineering system will be used.
- **18** Competitors compete at their own risk.
- 19 The Committee reserves the right to refuse an Eisteddfod entry and to alter the order of a program without prior notice.
- The Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or sub-divide sections based on the number of entries received.
- No protest concerning the eligibility of a competitor to compete will be permitted unless made in writing to the Eisteddfod Office on paper or via email (office@mackayeisteddfod.org) prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod, accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. No other protest or disputed matter will be permitted unless made in writing to the Eisteddfod Office on paper or via email (office@mackayeisteddfod.org) within half an hour of the case arising, accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. In all cases the fee will be forfeited if the protest or dispute is deemed frivolous.

- First, Second, Third and Highly Commended placings will be awarded in all sections (excluding Choral and Vocal Primary Group Sections where Gold, Silver and Bronze awards are given). The Adjudicator has the right to withhold any prize where he/she considers there is not sufficient merit.
- The Eisteddfod Committee will not be liable for any copyright infringement relating to the submission of digital and paper copies. Entrants submit copies and works at their own risk. All photocopies submitted for the Adjudicator's use will be destroyed after the completion of the section. One Music forms must be submitted with music copies.
- The use of mobile recording devices, videos and cameras by the audience is prohibited as the capturing of images of performers under 18 may constitute an offence. The Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to Photograph, record, film, broadcast, videotape or post on our website or Facebook page any item or section of the Eisteddfod. Competitors and/or winner's names and/or photographs may be published by the official photographer or the Eisteddfod committee. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office MUST BE notified in writing prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod.
- Every competitor has the right to feel safe at our event. It is strictly prohibited to repost or distribute any official or unofficial recording, photograph or message to a social platform or multiple recipients with the intent to menace/harass/intimidate/ridicule/humiliate a competitor. This will result in immediate disqualification from the current competition with consideration by the executive of exclusion from future events. All such matters, in consultation with the targeted person (victim), may be reported to police.
- Only competitors and designated teachers or studio/school representatives will be permitted backstage.
- No competitor will be allowed to have a mobile phone or other mobile device side stage. This applies to competitors across all art forms.
- No competitor may use the stage at any time without permission from the Stage Manager.
- The committee is unable to make special arrangements for any competitor (including out of town competitors) to appear other than as programmed. Except where clashes between Art forms occur refer point 8 above.
- A high standard of decorum is expected from all participants and spectators. Unseemly behavior will result in offenders being asked to leave and offending competitors being disqualified. In the event of property being damaged in any way, the offenders will be charged accordingly.
- The decision of the Committee shall be final and binding in all matters relating to the interpretation of the Rules and Conditions of the Eisteddfod.



Region (artform) add-ons are not included in storage plan pricing. The cost to add a Region to your account is \$2.50 and this can be done at any time. You must have an active storage plan to save your music. There are 3 plans available.



Further information will be emailed to competitors of each artform leading up to the eisteddfod, outlining all necessary details.

BALLET, TAP, MODERN AND NATIONAL DANCING RULES AND CONDITIONS

PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1a. No sand, water, powder, glitter, straw, glass or dangerous props will be permitted. No props requiring 240V power are to be used. Battery powered props are permitted. No props are to be tossed in a dangerous manner from the stage into the wings at any time. Competitors are requested to remove their props from the Theatre immediately after completion of the session in which they are used.
- 1b. Solo Props are limited to those that can be placed on stage (and removed) within a time limit of 1 minute. There will be no blackouts between solo competitors.
- 2. Competitors must dance in their own age section.
- 3. Competitors must not enter in more than one group in the same section.
- 4. In groups NO competitors may be over the age limit.

Time limits

Section	Maximum Time
Solos	3 minutes
Tiny Tots Solos	2½ minutes (3 minutes if item is song & dance)
Song & Dance Solos	4 minutes
Duos/Trios	4 minutes
Groups	6 minutes
Championship Solos	3 minutes

6. In Championship Sections there must be a minimum of four competitors, or the section may (at the discretion of the Committee) be cancelled.

To **ENTER** in Championship sections the competitor must compete in his/her age sections as well as the relevant Improvisation section ie:

Classical: Demi-Character solo, Classical solo and Classical Improvisation

Modern: Slow Modern/Contemporary solo, Up-Tempo Modern or Cabaret solo and Modern Improvisation

Tap: Tap solo, Speed Tap and Tap Improvisation

Note: No Waltz/Slow Tap is needed to qualify for the Championships.

Improvisation: If a competitor does not perform in program order, he/she is immediately disqualified from entering the Championships.

- 7. Recorded orchestral or instrumental arrangements will be allowed for all sections. Recordings with vocal backing may be used for Novelty sections, Tap, Cabaret, Slow Modern, Up-Tempo Modern, Tiny Tots and National Sections only. Please note there should be no tap sounds on backing tracks used for Tap Sections.
- 8. Song and Dance Routines Vocal backing is not permitted in the vocal part of the song but is acceptable in the dance routine. Marks will be allocated as follows: 50% singing and 50% dance.

- 9a. Definition of a Modern Solo A solo containing a Jazz, Modern, Contemporary or Neo-Classical style of movement. Slow or Up-Tempo is decided by the speed of the music. Up-Tempo Modern Solo may also include Hip Hop, Novelty or Cabaret.
- 9b. Up-Tempo Modern Group may include Hip Hop.
- 10. Music is required to be uploaded via Music Uploads. You are responsible to check the correct music is uploaded. Information on how and when to upload will be emailed to the email address attached to the entry. In the case of the music stopping due to equipment failure during a performance the following guidelines will apply:

<u>Solos</u> – The competitor should complete their performance without music unless the adjudicator rings the bell and requests the competitor to reperform again.

Groups – The studio teachers will have two options:

- a. The routine to continue without music until the end without penalty
- b. The teacher may call for a blackout, the group will stop, and may reperform at the end of the section without penalty
- 11. Competitors are asked to report to the Stage Manager immediately on arriving backstage to **check in**, and hand in the title of the Demi Character, National. Titles should be no longer than 10 words.
- 12. Dancers must use dressing rooms as allocated.
- 13. If a competitor forgets his/her dance and runs off stage, he/she may repeat the performance at the Adjudicator's discretion but will not be marked (except in the case of a technical fault).
- Attire for Improvisation sections Tap and Jazz: Plain coloured leotard/unitard (Black Jazz pants/shorts may be worn)
 Ballet: Plain coloured leotard (Short plain coloured ballet skirt may be worn)
- 15a. Props and assistance during items Only teachers or fellow competitors (no parents with exception to out of town competitors with prior approval) are allowed to assist with a prop (e.g. hand a stick, hat or other small prop in the wings) or push a button during the performance.
- 15b. No assistance with costuming side stage. No assistance side stage for Groups is permitted.
- 16. No students are to touch any sound equipment belonging to the Entertainment Centre.
- 17. There will be NO Stage Rehearsals permitted during the Eisteddfod, except for Tiny Tots. There is to be no audible music playing whilst rehearsing on stage, earphones are mandatory if the competitor wants to listen to their music.
- 18. Competitors may compete in a maximum of two Duo/Trio Sections but must not compete twice in the same section. No titles for Duo/Trio sections will be accepted.
- 19. Covers on tap shoes must be worn in the dressing rooms and backstage hallways.
- 20. Sections may be combined or split at the Committee's discretion.

This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

THE LIFE MEMBERS TROPHY

To be awarded to the competitor competing in and securing the most points in **all** the following sections: Classical Ballet, Demi-Character, National, Up-Tempo Modern and Tap Solo. This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

JUNIOR MODERN AGGREGATE

To the competitor (11 to 12 Years) competing in and securing most points in **all** the following sections: Up-Tempo Modern/Cabaret, Slow Modern/Contemporary, Modern Improvisation.

This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

INTERMEDIATE MODERN AGGREGATE

To the competitor (13 to 14 Years) competing in and securing most points in **all** the following sections: Up-Tempo Modern/Cabaret, Slow Modern/Contemporary, Modern Improvisation.

This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

SENIOR MODERN AGGREGATE

To the competitor (15 to 18 Years) competing in and securing most points in **all** the following sections: Up-Tempo Modern, Cabaret, Slow Modern/Contemporary, Modern Improvisation.

This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

JUNIOR TAP AGGREGATE

To the competitor (11 to 12 Years) competing in and securing the most points in **all** the following sections: Tap Solo, Waltz/Slow Tap, Speed Tap and Tap Improvisation. This is a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually, and a replica will be presented as a memento

INTERMEDIATE TAP AGGREGATE

Please read these rules carefully

- Own Choice Speech and Drama pieces must be lodged electronically via Music Uploads.
- Own Choice submission will open in the weeks leading up to the Eisteddfod, and all material must be uploaded to Music Uploads by Tuesday 16th September.
- Own Choice material will not be accepted after the nominated cut-off date.
- Own Choice material which is not submitted by the cut-off date will result in the competitor being disqualified. The competitor may still perform and obtain an adjudication sheet but will not receive a mark or placing.
- Own Choice material is to be typed, with the section number, section title, competitor number and competitor name clearly marked at the top of the page.
- The author/copyright holder of the work to be performed must be acknowledged at the beginning or end of the work.
- Scripts with "Author Unknown" are acceptable for most sections, however they are *not* accepted for Verse by an Australian Author or for Period Drama sections. ie for Sections 423, 429, 435, 441, 447, 454, the poet/playwright/author must be clearly marked.
- Any scripts from a play are also required to state the name of the play in addition to the author.



STORAGE PLAN PRICING

Region (artform) add-ons are not included in storage plan pricing. The cost to add a Region (artform) to your account is \$2.50 and this can be done at any time. You must have an active storage plan to save your music and Critiques. There are 3 plans available.



NOTE: Own choice submission will open approximately 4 weeks prior to the Eisteddfod starting. Further information, including all dates, will be emailed to competitors of each artform.

SPEECH AND DRAMA – RULES AND CONDITIONS

PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Solo competitors must compete in their applicable age-specific sections.
- 2. All Speech and Drama performances (excluding Prepared/Impromptu Reading Sections) are to be from memory.
- 3. Entrants must appear in their section in program order, or forfeit their right to perform, except where clashes between artforms occur, and prior arrangement has been made with a committee member at the Eisteddfod Office.
- 4. Where a large number of competitors dictates that any Section needs to be split into subsections, A, B, C etc, competitors will not be allowed to change to another sub-section.
- 5. No prompting shall be permitted from the audience or side stage. Competitors who are prompted by a person other than the adjudicator will be disqualified, and the person prompting will be asked to leave. No prompting shall be permitted from the wings of the theatre for groups.
- 6. If performances exceed time limits, points may be deducted or the competitor disqualified at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 7. Material being presented should be age appropriate and suitable for viewing by audiences of all ages. Please note that material based around themes of a highly sensitive nature such as abuse, violence, suicide or similar traumatic events are to be avoided because the committee is not in a position to provide appropriate and timely content warnings to its audiences. All submitted scripts shall be vetted, and where the adjudicator or committee have identified an item to be unsuitable for the age/section, or to contain sensitive topics that are inappropriate for general audience viewing, the competitor shall be disqualified, and that item shall not be permitted to be performed at any future Mackay Eisteddfod.
- 8. Competitors are not permitted to perform an item or part thereof which they have performed during the previous year's Eisteddfod. This includes Drama and Music Theatre Groups, where the competitor is deemed to be the studio or group they are performing under. Choral Speaking groups are excluded from this rule (ie Sections 474 to 483.)
- 9. Competitors are not permitted to perform the same script, or part thereof, in more than one section of the eisteddfod.
- 10. No member of a duologue or group will be permitted to perform with another duologue or group in the same section. (In the duologue sections all the details of both performers must appear on the entry form).
- 11. Duologue partners may be from different age groups; however, the competitors must perform in the age group of the elder student.
- 12. No parent or teacher will be allowed on stage with a competitor during a performance unless as a Conductor.
- 13. No sand, liquid, powder, glitter, straw, glass, or dangerous props will be permitted. Props requiring electrical power are *not* permitted. Flames are *not* permitted. Aerosol cans being used as props are *not* permitted to be sprayed. If food is to be used as a prop, it *must* remain in a sealed container or remain as a single unbroken/whole entity. If you are unsure whether your props comply with these rules, please confirm with the committee before the commencement of the eisteddfod. Props which do not comply with these requirements will not be permitted on stage, or if they are observed on stage, the competitor shall face disqualification.

- 14. Lighting requirements for Musical Theatre Groups, Dramatic Excerpt Groups and Group Mime sections should be discussed with the Stage Manager prior to the commencement of the relevant section. Lighting/Sound/Stage options for these sections are outlined on the final page of this schedule.
- 15. The Committee considers it highly unethical for a teacher or student to copy the work of another teacher or student particularly in regard to original work of a teacher or student.
- 16. In all Dramatic Excerpt and Musical Theatre Sections, five minutes will be allowed for setting the stage and five minutes allowed for striking the stage.
- 17. In Sections **474 482** group members must be students of the same Primary or Secondary School.
- 18. Where the number of voices is stated, the number must be strictly adhered to, otherwise the group will be disqualified. No interchange of choir members will be allowed during Section competition.
- 19. No member of one choir will be permitted to perform with another choir in the same Section.
- 20. Choirs will appear in order determined by ballot before the official program is printed and the order of appearance shall be as printed in the program.
- 21. Music/backing tracks are *not* permitted in any sections for Speech & Drama solos and duologues. Music/backing tracks *are* permitted for Dramatic Excerpt groups and Music Theatre Excerpt Groups, but they are *not* permitted for Choral Speaking or Mime Groups.
- 22. The following sections are *not* permitted to have full costumes or any sets/scenery Verse Recitation, Verse by an Australian Author, Humorous Verse, Prepared Reading. These sections are to have minimal movement only and may be accompanied by accessories and handheld props only.
- 23. For mime sections, competitors must wear theatre blacks. Allowable props are blocks/table/bench/chairs no other props allowed.
- 24. In Sections **403**, **407**, **411**, **415**, **419** pieces are to be of a serious nature. Material that is of a humorous nature may have points deducted or be disqualified.
- 24. Slam poetry and dub poetry are not permitted in Sections **403**, **407**, **411**, **415**, **419**, **424**, **430**, **436**, **442**, **448**, **452**. Please refer to the following definitions and guidelines:

Definition of Spoken Word/SLAM and Dub Poetry:

Spoken Word/SLAM poetry has a form with no specific rhyming scheme/pattern or poetic structure. They are written with the aim of being 'performed' live rather than being published in written form and typically address political and social issues. For example, poetry written by Anisa Nandaula, Warsan Shire and Ruby Franscisco are considered to be Spoken Word/SLAM poems.

Dub poetry is a type of Spoken Word performance poetry of Jamaican origin, which evolved from dub & reggae music (and is often performed to instrumental music of this style).

Performances in the Theatre

If you are performing in the theatre, you are required to register for your section with the Stage Manager. Arrive early and register your competitor number with the Stage Manager at least 15 minutes before your section begins. Be prepared to answer any questions about your performance, e.g. will you be starting on or off-stage? Will you finish by leaving the stage? What props do you require?

Once you have registered, please wait in the nominated area, as directed by the Stage Manager or marshal. If you are not present when you are called to the stage, you may miss your chance to perform. If you are waiting backstage, please be quiet as any noise backstage can be heard by the audience and may disrupt the person performing onstage. Persons making too much noise sidestage will be asked to leave and may therefore miss their opportunity to perform onstage.

All persons are required to wear closed shoes in all MECC dressing rooms, Green Room, backstage areas/hallways and stage – except for performers who are dressed in their stage costume/outfit.

Performances in the Space

When you arrive, you will be required to register for your solo or duo section. Please register with the marshal outside the Green Room and provide any additional information such as title and whether you start on/off stage.

For performances requiring costume changes, the Green Room will be available for competitors to change costumes. Please note that makeup is only allowed in the smaller dressing rooms within the Green Room (ie no makeup in the main area of the Green Room). Due to limited space, performers should arrive with hair and makeup already done, where possible.

Once a competitor is dressed for their section, they will be marshalled in the hallway outside the Green Room and lined up as per the order in the program. This is where the competitor will normally wait during their section while waiting to perform, and they will enter the stage from this hallway. Competitors may alternatively sit in the audience with their parents/teacher during their section and enter the stage directly from the audience – however if this is the case, then the competitor must inform the marshal on duty and purchase a ticket to sit in the audience. Speech and Drama teachers will be permitted to wait with their students during a section.

All persons are required to wear closed shoes in all MECC dressing rooms, Green Room, backstage areas/hallways and stage – except for performers who are dressed in their stage costume/outfit.

Information regarding Group Speaking Choirs for Schools Sections

Schools will need to email the number of students performing in the choir - please include staff in those numbers. These numbers shall be used for the allocated seating requirements in the auditorium. If more than four staff are required to accompany a choir, please contact the Eisteddfod Committee.

Finalised choir numbers will need to be emailed to office@mackayeisteddfod.org early in September. Schools will be notified of the date that this is due.

Rules for use of Green Room

- Privacy screens will be erected in the Green Room to designate the area for Eisteddfod Officials.
 Please do NOT enter the area beyond the privacy screens (which is clearly signed) as this area is reserved for Eisteddfod Officials only.
- Please note that beyond the privacy screens, the tea/coffee facilities and food provided is for Eisteddfod Officials only, so please do not help yourself to those items.
- The Green Room has been allocated to drama studios as a changing space only, not a common area, and like all other dressing rooms in the MECC, there is to be NO food or drink whatsoever consumed inside it (other than bottled water).
- The Green Room shall only open to competitors a half an hour prior to each session. ie 8am for the morning session, 12.30pm for the afternoon session and 6pm for the evening session.
- Once their section has commenced, competitors should not be waiting in the Green Room but rather lined up on the marshalling chairs outside the space.
- Finally, please ensure that noise levels in the Green Room (and in the hallway outside) are kept to a minimum.

The Green Room is a shared space with Eisteddfod officials, and all competitors, parents and teachers alike must abide by the rules outlined above. Persons who do not abide by the rules will be asked to leave.

All persons are required to wear closed shoes in all MECC dressing rooms, Green Room, backstage areas/hallways and stage – except for performers who are dressed in their stage costume/outfit.

- * A "wash" is a general "fill" of coloured light across the stage through the use of lighting fixtures using coloured lighting gels. It is important to let the MECC staff know that this will be used as the gels can run out and if they are unaware it may not be available on the day which is important because a number of studios use this on Groups Day.
- ^ A cyclorama or cyc is a large white curtain, positioned at the back of the stage area, used for projection or lighting purposes.
