

2023 AMENDMENTS AND REMINDERS

IMPORTANT NOTE:

- All information in the 2023 Syllabus is subject to NSW Health Guidelines at the time of the competition. Any changes that are required to comply with any directions will be made and refunds for entry fees provided to any affected parties minus any booking fees.
- There will be NO late entries or payments accepted entries close Friday 31 March 2023. Please do
 not leave it to the last minute to enter.

MAJOR CHANGES: GENERAL RULES

- The CHDES General Rules have been updated and are available on the CHDES website at https://coffseisteddfod.org.au/dance/. Please ensure you are familiar with the rules before the competition.
- **General Rule 7: Student Teachers:** Any student 18 years and under who teaches dance part time at the dance school or schools they currently attend are considered amateurs and as such are eligible to dance in all sections of the Coffs Harbour & District Dance Eisteddfod. Full Time Students attending Performance Schools are ineligible to enter.
- General Rule 18: Restricted Scholarships: To be eligible, competitors must live within the boundary
 and attending a Studio/Performing Arts / for classes regular classes within a 75-kilometre radius of
 Coffs Harbour CBD.

MAJOR CHANGES: DANCE RULES

- Dance tights or shorts are compulsory. In the spirit of our family-orientated event, and in the interests
 of child protection, please ensure that all dancers wear tights (minimum knee-length) or shorts during
 their performances.
- Appropriate costuming, language and choreography. Please ensure that the content of all
 performances is appropriate for all age groups. A reminder that routines that include bad language
 and/or adult costuming or themes are not appropriate for our event. Competitors may be disqualified,
 at the discretion of the Adjudicator or Committee.
- Entrants must leave the stage surface unaltered. If the performance requires extensive clean-up (e.g. petals, confetti, or feathers), please contact the Dance Coordinator for further information. No performer is to wear body paint.

SCHOOL GROUPS:

- A new Restricted section has been added for High School dance groups. This section is restricted to high schools within 75 km of Coffs Harbour CBD.
- Please note: High school sections will run first (from 9.00am), followed by primary school and small school sections

GROUPS:

Groups Weekend includes Monday 12 June 2023.

- Team choreography rules have been updated (refer to Dance Rule 27 for details). The age limit for team members is 15 years and older. No videoing or copying of music during rehearsal or at the performance venue. On arrival at the performance venue, all dancers will remain together in lockdown in a dedicated space. Each team will be called to the stage separately. Extra time will be added to the program to allow movement between the lockdown room and backstage.
- A new **National Dance** section has been added to bring a greater understanding and appreciation of other cultures. Costuming, music and choreography must be authentic. Competitors are requested to ensure that any songs or dances are performed in a culturally appropriate manner and the necessary consultation and permissions have been obtained before taking the stage. Please contact the Committee if you require further information. **This section will be a trial and has no entry fee for 2023.** It is open to all ages.
- Musical Theatre sections (under 12's, under 14's and Open) must include 100% singing and at least 50% dancing. Dancing whilst singing is permitted. No backing vocals are permitted. CHDES reserves the right to merge sections if there are fewer than three entries.
- Variety sections can include any dance style not already included in this syllabus, e.g. Comedy,
 Bollywood, Acro etc. Each routine must include at least 50% dancing and may have backing vocals.
 CHDES reserves the right to merge sections if there are fewer than three entries.
- Song and Dance sections must include 50% dancing and 50% singing. No backing vocals are permitted.
- It is a condition of entry that local studios provide a certain number of adult volunteers to assist over Groups weekend. Studios will be prompted to provide names of volunteers during the registration process on Comps Online.
- Please minimise the need for dancers to run behind stage during their performances. Space backstage
 is very limited at the Groups Weekend venue (refer to Dance Rule 25 for stage dimensions).
- Prize money for a studio costume fund is being offered for the Teacher Feature again in 2023.

SOLOS:

- Solo age the cut-off date is 1 June 2023. The competitor's age is taken to be their age as of 1 June 2023.
- Event fee: In addition to section entry fees, each soloist will be a charged a one off \$30.00 event fee that covers the cost of programming, APRA fees and unlimited entry for all competitors and spectators during the solo's competition, excluding the Awards Presentation Evening on Saturday 24 June 2023.
- Improvisations: Female competitors: Plain leotard must be worn, of one colour only. No patterned, lace, mesh, or floral leotards. Plain shorts or plain short ballet skirt may be worn. Male competitors: Plain slim fit shirt or singlet, of one colour only, and plain shorts or tights. No adornments such as flowers, headbands, earrings, glitter etc.

REMINDERS:

- Novice eligibility cut-off is 31 March 2023. If you have never won a first place in the relevant category
 in any Eisteddfod, (online or on stage) prior to 31 March 2023 you are eligible to compete in the
 Novice section.
- No teachers permitted backstage, refer to Dance Rule 5.
- Please do not risk disqualification by including a Teacher (not Student Teacher refer to Dance Rule 1)

in any section other than Mature and Motivated and Teacher Feature.

- Due to WHS requirements no competitor is permitted to jump or leave the stage from the front.
 Competitors may sit on the front of the stage as part of their routine but may not exit from the front of the stage.
- Scholarship qualification. Performers do not have to enter Championships for scholarship eligibility. To qualify, performers must compete in the Open (not Novice) section of their relevant age and style, in addition to competing in the corresponding Improvisation section.
- For **Groups**, no individual may perform more than twice (2 times) in any one section. If an individual performs more than twice in any section, all the groups they perform in will be disqualified, even if dancing for different studios. Studios **are no longer required to have a difference of three performers** if they only enter two routines in one section.
- Student helpers are young volunteers who are under the supervision of the Committee. We rely on their goodwill to run our Eisteddfod efficiently. Please direct any queries or suggestions to the Committee, not to the student helpers. Student helpers are to be 14yrs and older they will require parental/Guardian approval and a signed document allowing them to help.

PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIPS / MASTERCLASSES

Competitors entering the scholarship will attend a Masterclass provided by CHDES and the adjudicator. Finalists will be selected to perform in the final session and awards presentation on Saturday 24 June 2023.

Eligibility

To be eligible for masterclass scholarships, competitors must compete in their corresponding Open (not Novice) age sections and Improvisation in the appropriate dance styles.

Entries

If a minimum of 8 entries in each scholarship/masterclass section are not received, the Committee may exercise their discretion to combine scholarship/masterclass sections.

MONETARY SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are intended for the extension of studies. Monetary Scholarship winners are eligible to earn scholarships in any one section of the Eisteddfod three times, after which they become ineligible in that section for the following two years.

Monetary Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator from the Eligibility List supplied by the Dance Committee. To be eligible for the following Monetary Scholarships competitors must perform in age sections as follows. It **EXCLUDES NOVICE SECTIONS.**

SPECIAL RULES – DANCE

To be read in conjunction with the CHDES General Eisteddfod Rules 2023, available on the CHDES website: www.coffseisteddfod.org.au/dance

- All sections in both Groups and Solos are open to amateurs only. Professional dancers and teachers who
 derive a living from dance are not permitted to compete at the Coffs Harbour and District Dance
 Eisteddfod.
 - **Professional Dancer Defined**: Any person who has ever been a cast member and received payment for any **professional** dance, TV, Musical or Theatre production with a running time of four weeks or more is considered a professional and may not compete in the Coffs Harbour & District Eisteddfod.

 Teacher Defined: A person who is or has ever been employed to teach dance **professionally**.eg, has teaching qualifications or has been listed as teaching staff of a dance school on a full time or part time basis.
- 2. Full time dance students will not be permitted to compete at the Coffs Harbour and District Dance Eisteddfod. The definition of 'FULL TIME DANCE STUDENTS' for the purpose of competing in this Eisteddfod is any dancer enrolled in a full-time education dance course in any dance discipline regardless of actual hours involved (e.g. Certificate IV, Diploma or Bachelor of Dance). This includes dancers enrolled in correspondence schooling to train for dance full time.
- 3. This competition shall be open to AMATEURS ONLY. A person who owns, manages, is the principal teacher of a Performing Arts, Musical, Dance studio shall not be eligible to enter any section of the Eisteddfod, unless it is Teacher Feature (refer to rule 19).
- 4. Student Teachers: Any student 18 years and under who teaches dance part time at the dance school or schools they currently attend are considered amateurs and as such are eligible to dance in all open sections of the Coffs Harbour & District Dance Eisteddfod. Full Time Students attending Performance Schools are ineligible to enter. Where it is identified that a Teacher (not Student Teacher) is participating in a Group or Solo section (other than Mature and Motivated and Teacher Feature) that group or soloist WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.
- 5. Discourtesy to other competitors, volunteers, parents, or the Dance Committee will not be tolerated and may lead to disqualification of the solo performer or their Group. The Committee reserves the right to ask someone to leave who is causing disruption or refusing to follow the direction of the Committee or an official in the Auditorium. The Committee's decision is final.
- 6. Appropriate costuming, language and choreography. Please ensure that the content of all performances is appropriate for all audience age groups. Offensive language and adult costuming and themes are considered inappropriate for Eisteddfods. Disqualification is at the discretion of the Adjudicator or Committee.
- 7. Prompting or assistance of any kind must not be given. Parents and Teachers must leave the stage area during an item except for Groups and Solo sections 8 Years and Under (one support person only) and Baby Groups (up to two support persons). During Solos and Groups, the Backstage Assistants will help with props as required, i.e. if a prop needs to be handed to a dancer.
- 8. The Workcover Authority requires that all electrical equipment used at our dance venues, e.g. hairdryers, hair straighteners etc., be inspected by an authorised electrician and be tagged as required.
- 9. Curtains will not be used.
- 10. The Adjudicator may abbreviate or stop a dance at their discretion. This does not mean disqualification.

- 11. In the event of a section receiving fewer than three entrants, the committee reserves the right to merge age sections.
- 12. TIME LIMITS WILL BE ENFORCED. The Adjudicator is entitled to ring off any competitor who does not adhere to the time limits as described in the schedule. Please choose your music accordingly.

Solos Championships and Scholarships

Novice and Open: Maximum: 3 min Junior: Maximum: 3½ min

- 13. PROPS: NO SCENERY ALLOWED. Simple hand-held props (basket, scarf, doll, flowers, etc.) are permitted only if used in the routine. Each entrant is responsible for placing and removing their items on stage. Props must be easily carried backstage by the entrant without any assistance. No props requiring assembly on site will be permitted for safety reasons. Due to WHS requirements, props are to be brought backstage at the start of the section and removed at the end of the section. Due to limited change room space, we ask that props are promptly removed at the end of the session. Props may be more severely limited if COVID restrictions are still in place. Please consider the size of the stage at the performance venue, particularly on Groups weekend.
- 14. No backing vocals will be permitted in Song and Dance or Musical Theatre routines.

GROUPS

- 15. No individual can perform more than twice (2 times) in any one group section. If an individual performs more than twice in any section, all groups in which they have performed will be disqualified.
- 16. Groups must consist of a **minimum of four (4)** competitors. The Dance Committee reserves the right to combine age groups to ensure their inclusion.
- 17. **Small Group** sections must be a **minimum of 4 and a maximum of 9** competitors per group with a maximum of two (2) groups from the same Dance Studio per section. You **may not** repeat routines that are entered in other Group sections.
- 18. **Teacher Feature:** Teacher/s must be on stage for at least 50% of the dance and the performing teacher/s are to take an individual bow at the end of the dance for the benefit of the Adjudicator and audience. Teacher Feature may include any combination of students across all ages.

SOLOS (including Duo/Trio)

- 19. Competitors may dance in one solo only for each style of dance, with the exception of Championships and Scholarships. No competitor will be allowed to perform the same item twice, with the exception of Scholarships. A competitor may not dance in a Novice section and an Open section in the same style. A competitor may not dance in multiple age groups in the same style.
- 20. Competitors must qualify in their **Open (not Novice) solo sections** in their respective **age divisions** to be **eligible to compete** in their **relevant Championships**. Championship dances must be different to age qualifying dances.

- 21. **Duo/Trio:** Competitors dance in the age section of the eldest competitor. A competitor may perform more than once in the Duo/Trio section but in a different style and **cannot substitute partners after entry has been accepted or dance in other age groups.**
- 22. **Improvisations:** Music will be chosen by the Adjudicator. Competitors in Demi-Character improvisations will be shown the prop/s or theme, if applicable, before hearing the music.

Female competitors: Plain leotard must be worn, of one colour only. To avoid disappointment or disqualification, please ensure there are no patterned, lace, mesh, or floral leotards. Plain shorts or plain short ballet skirt may be worn. See examples below.

Male competitors: Plain slim-fit shirt or singlet, of one colour only, and plain shorts or tights. See examples below.

No adornments such as flowers, headbands, earrings, glitter etc. The purpose of the plain dancewear is to ensure that all competitors are adjudicated on their interpretation of the music and steps performed, not on their 'costume'.



23. **6 years and Under - Encouragement Solo (500):** This section is **non-competitive** but will receive an adjudication critique. It is designed to nurture our young dancers. Each competitor will receive an Encouragement Award and a medal. A dancer may enter in this section twice, provided that a different style has been chosen from the following: Classical, Demi-Character, Modern, Jazz, or Tap, however will

only receive one award. Entrants are **unable** to compete in **Under 8** sections if they compete in this section.

24. **Own Choreography:** Dancers are to choose own music and choreograph own dance. Costume to suit dance. The composition must be the student's own work with no teacher assistance.

25. **COPYRIGHT**

Private videography and photography with any device is prohibited in the auditorium or the change rooms at all times. The Coffs Harbour and District Eisteddfod Society has engaged professionals who have sole rights and comply with the Information Privacy Act. Breaches of this rule may cause disqualification of the studio represented by the infringing parent/s or friends. Rules and regulations as set down by Australasian Performing Right Association (APRA). Compliance with Copyright Law is the responsibility of the individual. Each competitor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Coffs Harbour and District Eisteddfod Society Inc. against any breach of Copyright. Each Competitor is responsible for obtaining permission from the copyright owner. These rules are in accordance with the directions of APRA, the Australasian Mechanical Copyright Owners Society (AMCOS) and Copyright Agencies Limited (CAL). All entrants will be required to supply their studio's APRA registration number in their entry.

26. MUSIC UPLOADS

Competitors must upload their music to Music Uploads online (www.musicuploads.com.au) by the date specified by the Dance Committee. No other options will be given.

This is a low-cost service that stores your music and voice critiques in one location and can be used at other participating competitions. Please refer to the Music Uploads website for full information.

It is the responsibility of the competitors to ensure that they have the correct music files uploaded to each routine. You can change your music files at any time before the cut-off dates (TBA).

27. All mobile phones and electronic devices must be turned off while in the auditorium. Dancers in Improvisations and the Team Choreography competition must not have access to mobile phones or other electronic devices.

STAGE FLOOR AND DIMENSIONS

28. The stage is covered by Tarkett. PLEASE check tap shoes for protruding screws. Neither venue has a sprung floor, gymnastic/acro routines are performed at the competitor's own risk. Stage performance dimensions are approximately:

Coffs Harbour Education Campus	Back 6 metres wide; front 12.6 metres wide; depth 6 metres; two wings
Jetty Memorial Theatre	7.5 metres wide × 7.5 metres deep; two wings

- 29. **OPEN AGE TEAM CHOREOGRAPHY** (subject to NSW Health regulations at the time)
- a. Teams to consist of a minimum of 4 and maximum of 10 dancers. Each member of the team must perform in at least two other group dances, any style, at the Eisteddfod.
- b. All participants must be a senior and a minimum of 15 years of age.
- c. Each team will be provided with a separate room to rehearse and will be separated from the rest of the Eisteddfod participants and their teachers until after the performance so each team will need to bring water and refreshments.
- d. Teams will be given a piece of music, chosen by the Adjudicator, on the morning of Saturday 10 June 2023,

- prior to the commencement of Saturday's sections and they will have approximately 3 hours (or as deemed by the Dance Committee) to choreograph a dance of any genre.
- e. Studios may enter more than one team, but participants must be different in each team and the first team entered must have the minimum number of **6 dancers** before a second team is entered.
- f. Each team is to dress in plain black dance pants or plain black dance shorts and plain black leotard or plain black t-shirt. No mesh or lace allowed. This will be monitored.
- g. No team member is to have in their possession a mobile phone or any electronic device during or after rehearsal until the team has performed their routine. Discovery of any such device will mean the disqualification of the team. Supervisors can be contacted if necessary.
- h. The Dance Committee will provide any props deemed necessary. All teams will be provided with exactly the same props. The Adjudicator may take the use of props into account when making their decision if they felt it added to the performance.
- i. Each team will be supervised by an independent adult volunteer at each rehearsal location. Each Supervisor will be in attendance at their appointed studio with the music and props as deemed necessary at 8.45am on Saturday 10 June 2023 for a 9.00am start. Each Supervisor will be provided with the music on USB and a copy of the competition rules. Teams will need to meet at their appointed location, which will be advised to the Dance Studio prior to the date of competition, ready for a 9.00am start. Local studios entering are asked to provide both an adult volunteer and a space for their groups and an additional space for visiting groups if possible.
- j. Teams will be judged on:
 - Interpretation of the music

- Teamwork
- Choreography (to be team's own work)
- Technique and presentation.
- k. Teams are <u>NOT</u> allowed to jump off the front of the stage due to WHS requirements. Teams may sit on the front of the stage but may not exit the stage from the front.
- I. Teams must finish their dance at the same time as the music.
- m. No phones or recording of music is allowed for practice after the rehearsal closing time.
- n. On arrival at the performance venue, dancers will remain together in lockdown until their performance. Each team will be called in turn to the stage (**no waiting backstage**). Extra time will be allocated in the program to allow teams to walk from the lockdown room to the stage.
- 30. **Variety Groups:** Can be any dance style not already included in this syllabus, e.g. Variety, Comedy, Acro, Bollywood, National Character etc.
- 31. Musical Theatre Groups: No vocal backing allowed. Must contain at least 50% dancing.
- 32. Any performer who leaves the stage during their solo routine may perform the routine again and will receive an Adjudicator's critique, however, they are ineligible to place.
- 33. **Street Dance:** Any modern style including hip hop, funk and break. With relaxed arms and body, wearing street style shoes and clothing.
