PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIPS/MASTERCLASSES

Format

Competitors entering the performance scholarship will attend a Masterclass provided by CHDES and the adjudicator. Finalists will be selected to perform at the Gala/Awards events on Sunday 21 June 2026.

Eligibility

To be eligible for Performance Scholarships Masterclasses, performers must compete in the Open (**not Novice**) section of their relevant age and style, in addition to competing in the corresponding Improvisation section.

Performers do not have to enter Championships for performance scholarship masterclass eligibility.

Entries

If a minimum of 8 entries in each performance scholarship/masterclass section are not received, the Committee may exercise their discretion to combine Performance Scholarship/Masterclass sections.

Dance attire

Improvisation rules apply. Female competitors: Plain leotard of one colour only. No patterns, lace, mesh or floral leotards. Plain shorts or plain ballet skirt may be worn. No adornments such as flowers, headbands, earrings, glitter etc. Male competitors: Plain slim-fit shirt or singlet, of one colour only, and plain shorts or tights.

MONETARY SCHOLARSHIPS

These monetary scholarships are intended for the extension of studies. Monetary Scholarship winners are eligible to earn scholarships in any one section for two years, after which they become ineligible in that section for the following two years.

Monetary Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator from the eligibility list supplied by the Dance Committee. To be eligible for the following Monetary Scholarships competitors must perform in age sections as follows.

2026 UPDATES AND REMINDERS

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Entries close Tuesday 31 March 2026. **Late entries close Sunday 5 April 2026 and will incur a \$25 fee.**
- All information in the 2026 Rules & Regulations is subject to NSW Health Guidelines at the time of the competition. Any changes that are required to comply with any directions will be made and refunds for entry fees provided to any affected parties minus any booking fees.

CHANGES TO OUR 2026 EVENT

- An **All Abilities** section (709) will be introduced in 2026 for dancers with special needs. The section is open to soloists, duos/trios, and groups, and may be incorporated into the Education Schools or Groups Weekend program, depending on entries.
- **Street Dance improvisation** sections (693, 694, 695) have been introduced for U12, U14 and Open age groups.
 - **Adult Dance sections** (990, 991, 992) will be trialled in 2026, to encourage participation by anyone in our community who loves movement and performance, regardless of age. Please contact the Dance Coordinators if you have any questions. Adult Dance has a minimum Age 20 years (as at June 1 2026)
- Open Age now has a maximum age of 19 years (as at June 1 2026)
- **New Dance Rule 23 has been added regarding privacy and the use of images.** Please read carefully and contact the Committee if required.

GENERAL RULES

- The CHDES Rules & Regulations have been updated and are available on the CHDES website at <https://coffseisteddfod.org.au/>. Please ensure you are familiar with the rules before the competition.

REMINDERS

- The \$30.00 event fee paid by each solo competitor covers the cost of **unlimited admission to the Jetty Theatre for all competitors and spectators during Solos Week**, excluding the Gala/Awards event. Families and supporters are encouraged to take advantage of this great offer and join the audience to enjoy the incredible talent on stage.
- **Dance tights or shorts are compulsory.** In the spirit of our family-orientated event, and in the interests of child protection, please ensure that all dancers wear tights **or** mid length shorts during their performances.
- **Appropriate costuming, language and choreography.** Please ensure that the content of all performances is appropriate for all age groups. A reminder that routines that include bad language and/or adult costuming or themes are not appropriate for our event. Competitors may be stopped and disqualified at the discretion of the Adjudicator or Committee.
- **Entrants must leave the stage surface unaltered.** If the performance requires extensive clean-up (e.g. petals, confetti, or feathers), please contact the Dance Coordinator for further information. No performer is to wear body paint unless required in the National/Cultural section.
- **Variety:** Song and Dance items are not eligible for entry in Variety. Please enter sections 743, 744, or 745.
- No large props allowed.
- No teachers permitted backstage, with the exception of Encouragement Solo (Under 6) and Under 8 sections.
- **Solo age cut-off is 1 June 2026.** The competitor's age is taken to be their age as of 1 June 2026.

- **Novice eligibility cut-off is 31 March 2026.** If a competitor has never won a first place in the relevant category in any Eisteddfod (online or on stage) prior to 31 March 2026, they are eligible to compete in the Novice section.
- **Performance Scholarship** qualification. Performers do not have to enter Championships for scholarship eligibility. To qualify, performers must compete in the Open (**not Novice**) section of their relevant age and style, in **addition** to competing in the corresponding Improvisation section.
- **Demi-Character Soloists:** Competitors in Demi-Character sections must tell the backstage manager the title of their demi-character before the section begins.
- Due to WHS requirements **no** competitor is permitted to **jump, leave or enter the stage from the front.** Competitors may sit on the front of the stage as part of their routine but may not exit from the front of the stage.

DANCE RULES: SOLOS WEEK

COMPETITORS

1. All Solo sections are open to **AMATEURS** only. Professional dancers and teachers who derive a living from dance are not permitted to compete at the Coffs Harbour & District Dance Eisteddfod, with the exception of some Group sections and the Adult Open solo sections.

Professional Dancer Defined: Any person who has ever been a cast member and received payment for any professional dance, TV, Musical or Theatre production with a running time of four weeks or more is considered a professional and may not compete in the Coffs Harbour & District Dance Eisteddfod.

Teacher Defined: A person who is or has ever been employed to teach dance professionally, e.g., has teaching qualifications or has been listed as teaching staff of a dance school on a full-time or part-time basis.

A person who owns, manages, or is the principal teacher of a Performing Arts, Musical, or Dance studio shall not be eligible to enter any section of the Eisteddfod, unless it is Mature and Motivated, Teacher Feature, or Adult Open solo sections.

2. **Full-time dance students** will not be permitted to compete at the Coffs Harbour and District Dance Eisteddfod. The definition of 'full-time dance students' for the purpose of competing in this Eisteddfod is any dancer enrolled in a full-time education dance course in any dance discipline regardless of actual hours involved (e.g. Certificate IV, Diploma or Bachelor of Dance). This includes dancers enrolled in correspondence schooling to train for dance full time.

3. **Student teachers.** Any student who teaches dance part-time at the dance school or schools they currently attend are considered amateurs and as such are eligible to dance in all open sections of the Coffs Harbour & District Dance Eisteddfod. Full-time students attending Performance Schools are ineligible to enter. Where it is identified that a Teacher (not Student Teacher) is participating in a Group or Solo section (other than Mature & Motivated, Teacher Feature or Adult Open sections) that group or soloist WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

SOLO SECTIONS

4. **Song and Dance:** No backing vocals will be permitted. Must include 50% singing and 50% dancing.

5. **Variety:** Can be any dance style not already included in the list of sections, e.g. Comedy, Acro, National Character etc. Song and Dance items are not eligible for entry in Variety.

6. **Street Dance:** Any modern style including hip hop, funk and break. With relaxed arms and body, wearing street style shoes and clothing.

7. **6 years and Under - Encouragement Solo (510):** This section is non-competitive but will receive an adjudication critique. It is designed to nurture our young dancers. Each competitor will receive an Encouragement Award. A dancer may enter in this section twice, provided that a different style has been chosen from the following: Classical, Demi-Character, Modern/Lyrical, Jazz or Tap, however will only receive one award. Entrants are unable to compete in Under 8 sections if they compete in this section, with the exception of Improvisation sections.

8. **Improvisations:** Music will be chosen by the Adjudicator. Dancers must not have access to mobile phones or other electronic devices. Competitors in Demi-Character improvisations will be shown the prop/s or theme, if applicable, before hearing the music.

Female competitors: Plain leotard must be worn, of one colour only. To avoid disappointment or disqualification, please ensure there are no patterned, lace, mesh, or floral leotards. Plain shorts or plain short ballet skirt may be worn. See examples below.

Male competitors: Plain slim-fit shirt or singlet, of one colour only, and plain shorts or tights. See examples below.

No adornments such as flowers, headbands, earrings, glitter etc. The purpose of the plain dancewear is to ensure that all competitors are adjudicated on their interpretation of the music and steps performed, not on their 'costume'.



9. Competitors may dance in one solo only for each style of dance, with the exception of Championships and Scholarships. No competitor will be allowed to perform the same item twice, with the exception of Scholarships. A competitor may not dance in a Novice section and an Open section in the same style. A competitor may not dance in multiple age groups in the same style.

10. Competitors must qualify in their Open (not Novice) solo sections in their respective age divisions to be eligible to compete in Championships. Championship dances must be different to age qualifying dances.

11. Duo/Trio: Competitors dance in the age section of the eldest competitor. A competitor may perform more than once in the Duo/Trio section but in a different style and **cannot substitute partners after entry has been accepted or dance in other age groups.**

12. In the event of a section receiving fewer than three entrants, the committee reserves the right to merge age sections.

ON STAGE

13. **Appropriate costuming, language and choreography.** Please ensure that the content of all performances is appropriate for all audience age groups. Offensive language and adult costuming and themes are considered inappropriate for Eisteddfods. Disqualification is at the discretion of the Adjudicator or Committee.

14. **No large props allowed.** Simple hand-held props (basket, scarf, doll, flowers, etc.) are permitted only if used in the routine. Each entrant is responsible for placing and removing their items on stage. Props must be easily carried backstage by the entrant without any assistance. No props requiring assembly on site will be permitted for safety reasons. Due to WHS requirements, props are to be brought backstage at the start of the section and removed at the end of the section. Due to limited change room space, we ask that props are promptly removed at the end of the session. Props may be more severely limited if COVID restrictions are still in place. Please consider the size of the stage at the performance venue.

15. **Time limits will be enforced.** The Adjudicator is entitled to ring off any competitor who does not adhere to the time limits as described in the schedule (see page 4 for more information. Please choose your music accordingly.

16. Prompting or assistance of any kind must not be given. Parents and Teachers must leave the stage area during an item except for Solo sections 8 Years and Under (one support person only) and Encouragement Solo (up to two support persons). Backstage Assistants will help with props as required, i.e. if a prop needs to be handed to a dancer.

17. Any performer who leaves the stage during their solo routine may perform the routine again and will receive an Adjudicator's critique, however, they are ineligible to place.

18. The Adjudicator may abbreviate or stop a dance at their discretion. This does not mean disqualification.

VENUE

19. The stage is covered by Tarkett. PLEASE check tap shoes for protruding screws. The Solos venue does NOT have a sprung floor. Gymnastic/acro routines are performed at the competitor's own risk. Performers are also to take duty of care for their own performance to reduce risk and injury. Entrants are responsible for their own property and belongings.

Stage performance dimensions are approximately: 7.5 metres wide × 7.5 metres deep; two wings

20. Curtains will not be used.

21. The Workcover Authority requires that all electrical equipment used at our dance venues, e.g. hairdryers, hair straighteners etc., be inspected by an authorised electrician and be tagged as required.

COPYRIGHT

22. Private videography and photography with any device is prohibited in the auditorium or the change rooms at all times. The Coffs Harbour and District Eisteddfod Society has engaged professionals who have sole rights and comply with the Information Privacy Act. Breaches of this rule may cause disqualification of the studio represented by the infringing parent/s or friends. Rules and regulations as set down by Australasian Performing Right Association (APRA). Compliance with Copyright Law is the responsibility of the individual. Each competitor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Coffs Harbour and District Eisteddfod Society Inc. against any breach of Copyright. Each Competitor is responsible for obtaining permission from the copyright owner. These rules are in accordance with the directions of APRA, the Australasian Mechanical Copyright Owners Society (AMCOS) and Copyright Agencies Limited (CAL). All entrants will be required to supply their studio's APRA registration number in their entry.

PRIVACY AND USE OF IMAGES

23. By submitting an entry to the Coffs Harbour & District Eisteddfod, you **acknowledge and consent to the recording, use and publication of images and/or footage** for promotional, marketing and media purposes, including on social media and in media releases. If you do not consent to this use, you must notify the event coordinators or the Executive Committee in writing prior to participation.

MUSIC

24. Competitors must upload their music to Music Uploads online (www.musicuploads.com.au) by the date specified by the Dance Committee. No other options will be given. This is a low-cost service that stores your music and voice critiques in one location and can be used at other participating competitions. Please refer to the Music Uploads website for full information. It is the responsibility of the competitors to ensure that they have the correct music files uploaded to each routine. You can change your music files at any time before the cut-off dates (TBA).

AUDIENCE ETIQUETTE

25. Discourtesy to other competitors, volunteers, parents, or the Dance Committee will not be tolerated and may lead to disqualification of the solo performer or their Group. The Committee reserves the right to ask someone to leave who is causing disruption or refusing to follow the direction of the Committee or an official in the Auditorium. The Committee's decision is final.
26. All **mobile phones and electronic devices** must be turned off while in the auditorium.
27. Private videography and photography with any device is prohibited in the auditorium or the change rooms at all times.

PLEASE NOTE:

The above rules pertain to **Solos Week**.

There are separate Dance Eisteddfod Rules and Regulations for Schools Day and Groups Weekend.
