RULES

- 1. Age is recognized as at 1^{st} of January 2024. (Proof of age may be required).
- 2. No entry will be accepted unless full entry fees are received. No entry will be accepted via email, all entries must go through comps online. (www.comps-online.com.au)
- 3. Competitors must be present to perform in the order shown in the official program. No competitor will be allowed to compete outside the time scheduled for their section.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time by varying the order of competitors.
- 5. A competitor may only enter his/her own age group, unless in a duo, trio, group or open section. Any competitor is also eligible to enter an open section although the work must be of open standard.
- 6. In duet/trio sections an individual may enter with different partners. These entries are limited to TWO. All names must be shown on the entry form or entries will not be accepted. However, in the event of a competitor not being able to perform, the Committee will allow a substitute.
- 7. No competitor shall be allowed to render the same item, or variation thereof, within the same discipline of the current Eisteddfod.
- 8. Prompting or assistance of any kind may not be given. Parents setting up props on the stage must leave the backstage area prior to the commencement of their child's item. Teachers will only be permitted backstage at the request of the Chairperson, or a member of the Committee or if in charge of a group aged 8 years & under.
- 9. A group section is defined as four (4) or more competitors, players, or actors.
- 10. It is the responsibility of the competitor and/or parent to list the correct section numbers on entry forms. The Committee accepts no responsibility for incorrect entries received.
- 11. Covid 19 rules and restrictions may apply and will be outlined during the Eisteddfod.
 - The event will be ticketed all attendees, excluding competitors are to purchase an entry wristband prior to the Eisteddfod.
 - Wristbands are to be worn throughout the entirety of your visit.
- 12. <u>Adjudicator</u> The Adjudicator may divide, reduce or withdraw prizes, in any section, if a satisfactory standard is not reached.
- 13. Communication with the Adjudicator in person, via text or email by teachers, competitors or parents during the competition is strictly forbidden. Failure to comply will mean immediate disqualification.

- 14. If, through unforeseen circumstances, the Adjudicator is unable to perform his/her duties, the committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute.
- 15. No entry for a section will be accepted from any person who is or was, during the six (6) months preceding the Eisteddfod, a pupil of the Adjudicator for that discipline.
- 16. 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be awarded in all sections regardless of number of competitors, at the discretion of the adjudicator.
- 17. Protests, if any, are to be lodged with a Committee member within 30 minutes of the completion of the section concerned. A fee of \$10 must accompany all protests and will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous or unfounded. The decision of the Committee in all questions or disputes arising out of, or not provided for in, these rules SHALL BE FINAL.
- 18. Teachers of the various arts are permitted to enter Open Sections.
- 19. <u>Music</u> All dance music files and vocal backing tracks, (not sheet music) must be uploaded via 'Music Uploads' (<u>www.musicuploads.com.au</u>). The Inverell Eisteddfod Society will take no responsibility for incorrect labelling or late submission of music. All enquiries must go through 'Music Uploads'. A backup copy of music must be available on USB in the event that there is a problem with music playing.
- 20. Offensive language or material in any section may risk disqualification.
- 21. Please be aware age-appropriate Costumes and Music must be adhered to or the competitor may be penalized by the adjudicator.
- 22. Entries are final and no refunds will be given.
- 23. Each entrant, volunteer and member recognises that the Inverell Eisteddfod Society is insured for public liability which does not comprehensively cover injury to performers, and the individuals or schools must ensure that they are adequately covered whilst performing in these competitions or otherwise enter at their own risk. The Society takes care but is not responsible for the loss or damage of any item (e.g. books, papers, props, costumes, instruments or personal possessions of entrants).
- 24. **Local Competitor** refers to competitors who reside with the Inverell Shire Local Government area.
- 25. Perpetual Awards: All perpetual trophies/awards not identified as 'local' will be open to all competitors eligible to be awarded by the Adjudicator.
- 26. <u>Videography and photography</u> by members of the audience in the Auditorium during the Eisteddfod is illegal and strictly prohibited. A professional videographer and or photographer will be arranged by the Society. If these services are not available refer to the Secretary's Table to review rules associated. The Society has the right to record, film, broadcast, telecast, videotape or photograph any entrant, items or event in the Eisteddfod without notification (except for Schools that provide NO MEDIA RELEASE). By submitting an entry, the entrant automatically grants permission for the Society to use their image for publicity or promotional purposes.

27. Championships:

Items performed during the Eisteddfod may NOT be repeated in the Championship Section. Championships will be run regardless of the number of entries received and will be awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

It is important that all competitors and teachers realise and understand their responsibilities as set out under the Australian Copyright Act 1968.

Rules Specific to Dance Only

- 29. In Dance Sections, vocal backing is not permitted in the vocal section of any Song & Dance item. Some newer backing tapes may have fragments of added harmonization, which is acceptable.
- 30. Competitors in improvisations must wear plain class leotard, no bling, sequins, etc. plain coloured shorts or skirts are permitted. Any competitor presenting for impro in inappropriate outfit will have one chance to change while in the toilets awaiting their turn in the impro but must be able to change themselves. No hair accessories.
- 31. ACRO We support creativity and expression in dance and understand it is a constantly evolving art form, however in dance sections other than Acro a limited number of Acro/Gymnastic tricks are permissible, and while tricks are fun to watch we expect the routine will primarily be a dance routine with the focus being dance technique and choreography. An Acro/Gymnastics trick is defined as movements that pass through or stop at a fully inverted (upside down) position with both feet off the floor (the torso passing or stopping directly over the top of one's head/shoulders) e.g. Walkovers, Round offs, Baranis, Handsprings etc. The Adjudicator will decide on the day the value of any content of the routine.
 - All Acro routines are performed at the Competitor's own risk.
- 32. Commencing with the wrong music will be tolerated, provided the dancer has not begun the routine. If a competitor has a memory lapse and runs offstage, they will be permitted to attempt their routine again at the end of the section if time permits, and at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee for a critique only. Prompting is not permitted.

- 33. Programs will be emailed no charge. When entering through Comps-Online, if you need to submit a second entry form due to missing items, please contact us at ies.entries@hotmail.com to receive a one-time use coupon code to waiver the fee. Alternatively, limited programs will be available for purchase at the venue.
- 34. Competitors will not be able to take the stage to perform if they are not wearing Dance tights. **Dance tights MUST be worn for all dance sections.**
- 35. No-one except competitors performing in the immediate section are to be side stage. Competitors may enlist help to place props on the stage and retrieve props offstage. However, those persons assisting shall be aware that no persons other than the announcer and music player will be allowed side stage during the performance.

Rules Specific to Music, Speech & Drama

- 36. Backing tracks may be used to accompany competitors in all vocal sections including Championship. Backing tracks may comprise multiple instruments but must NOT contain lyric or vocal backing. Backing tracks should showcase but not overpower the competitor's performance.
- 37. Arts for All competitors **ARE** permitted vocal backing.
- 38. The Committee does not provide an Official Accompanist. Competitors are responsible for providing their own accompanist. However, it this is not possible please contact the music coordinator for a list of local people prepared to act in this role. Competitors should make arrangements and negotiate fees with the accompanist at least three weeks prior to the performance.
- 39. Novice Sections are for students who have received tuition in their discipline for less than 12 months, prior to the opening of the eisteddfod. Novice students are not eligible for Championship sections.

40. SPEECH & DRAMA CHAMPIONSHIP

Competitors must present, two (2), in any order, either Prose/Verse/Dramatic Sketch. 10 minute time limit. Competitors in this section must also participate in at least two (2) other sections in the Speech & Drama Eisteddfod.

41. ADJUDICATOR'S COPY (IN RELATION TO MUSIC/SPEECH & DRAMA ENTRIES)

Set Pieces - The Adjudicator must work from an original.

- Own Choice If you own original music controlled by an OneMusic Australia Publisher, you may make a single photocopy for the use of the Adjudicator. The photocopy is made and used solely for the purpose of adjudication and must be clearly marked "Adjudication copy only". The Eisteddfod Committee destroys the copy upon completion of the adjudication. A copy of the OneMusic Australia "Performer's Declaration" (attachment A in the syllabus and included in the program) must be attached to the photocopy
- 42. The law of Copyright applies to the Eisteddfod. If not performing from memory, all competitors must perform from the original copy of music, poetry etc. Adjudicator's copies must be clearly marked with Section Number and Competitor's Number. A Copyright Declaration Form must be attached to each copy. These forms will be available with the Eisteddfod Program and at the Secretary's Table during the Eisteddfod. All photocopies will be destroyed at the completion of the adjudication. It is the responsibility of all performers to ensure that their performance is not in breach of copyright. For more information please go to https://www.onemusic.com.au.

Please read these rules carefully, especially rules concerning Championships. Failure to comply with any of the rules and conditions may involve disqualification and withholding of prizes. All entries are received subject to these rules and conditions, which shall not be subject to any appeal at Law as being contrary to the spirit of friendly competition upon which the Eisteddfod is based.

Competitors should make arrangements and negotiate fees with the accompanist at least three weeks prior to the performance.

Time Limits. All Vocal Sections have a time limit of four (4) minutes, except for Open Choir sections where 2 songs are sung or where otherwise stated. Junior and Intermediate Championship Sections have a combined limit of eight (8) minutes. Senior and Open Championships have a combined limit of ten (10) minutes. These limits will be enforced. All Music sections are OWN CHOICE unless otherwise stated.
