Each May, Gulgong hosts the Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod. Gulgong is a New South Wales gold rush town which is located approximately 300km Northwest of Sydney and 30km from Mudgee.

The Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod was started by the Gulgong Musical and Dramatic Society (MADS) in 1980. Gulgong MADS are an active performing group who work together to maintain the historical Prince of Wales Opera House located in Mayne Street Gulgong. This building is the oldest operating Opera House in the southern hemisphere!

Gulgong MADS developed the Eisteddfod as a suitable event to be held in their beautiful, historic Gulgong Prince of Wales Opera House, to provide an opportunity, for young people especially, to delight in the creative and performing arts.

Over the decades, The Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod has expanded and become an important cultural event for Gulgong and the Central West. The Eisteddfod has grown so much it is now held at two locations: The Gulgong Prince of Wales Opera House and the Gulgong Memorial Hall.

The Eisteddfod is a subsidiary of Gulgong MADS. Our main aim is to provide opportunities for students of Music, Dance and Speech & Drama to set themselves goals and perform in front of an audience and adjudicator. While most of the classes are aimed at school-age children, there are opportunities for adults to participate in Music choirs, bands, duets, open solos and as accompanists. There is also a non-competitive class open to professionals, to allow them too, to perform in a beautiful and acoustically phenomenal space. Profits from the Eisteddfod go towards maintaining the Gulgong Prince of Wales Opera House.

The Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod is run by a small sub-committee with Gulgong MADS continued support. The Eisteddfod Committee would like to thank MADS for supporting this annual showcase of young talent.

RULES GOVERNING COMPETITION FOR MUSIC SECTION

Failure to comply with any of the following rules and conditions may involve disqualification and withholding of prizes. The decision of the Eisteddfod Committee on all questions of dispute arising out of, or not provided for, by these Rules and Conditions shall be final. All entries are received subject to this decision, which shall not be subject to any appeals by law, as such could be contrary to the spirit of friendly competition upon which the Eisteddfod is based.

Bad language and bad sportsmanship by entrants, their relatives or friends will not be tolerated, and offenders will be asked to leave the venue. Entrants related to, or associated with, offenders may be disqualified.

1. Acceptance of Rules & Conditions

All entries are received according to the conditions and rules of the Eisteddfod Committee. Please read the rules carefully and check all entries as no alterations can be made once the program has been printed. We recommend you print a copy of your entry to verify the details are correct. If you realise you have made an error in your entry, contact the Music Convenor as soon as possible.

2. Accompaniment

No official accompanist will be available for vocal and instrumental classes. Competitors are responsible for arranging their own accompanist. All negotiations are between the competitor and the accompanist. There is a list of local accompanists on page 3; however, competitors may also provide their own. The accompaniment must be of a different instrument family. There are to be **no vocals on backing tracks** in any solo, ensemble or choir item in Vocal classes.

3. Adjudicators

The Adjudicator reserves the right to terminate a performance at any stage. The Adjudicator's decision is final unless a protest is lodged under Rule 29, in which case the Eisteddfod Committee's decision is final. The Adjudicator also reserves the right to vary the allocation of prizes within a class, or if a satisfactory standard is not reached, to reduce or withdraw prizes. No competitor, teacher, parent or relative of a competitor may approach the adjudicator; any communication **must** be through the Session Convenor or Scribe.



4. Adjudicators' Reports

These will be available free of charge after the adjudication of the class and may be obtained from the clerk's desk. They will not be forwarded afterward. Please be patient with Eisteddfod volunteers whilst awaiting your report/s.

5. Admission

Competitors and accompanists will be admitted free to the hall only in sessions where they are competing. Please see admission fees for other sessions.

6. Age/Grade Limit

The competitor's age or grade level is recognised as on the 1st May each year. Where competitors of different ages compete in duets or groups, **the age limit for entry to that class will be based on the age of the oldest competitor**. The Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor or their teacher to provide proof of age, and to withhold any prizes until such proof has been obtained.

7. Amateurs

All competitions are intended for amateurs only, except for those listed in the syllabus as being open to professionals as well. Where group classes are open to professionals, no more than 50% of the group may be professionals. **An amateur is one who does not, or has not, obtained his or her living by performing or teaching that branch which is subject to competition.**

8. Audio Files

Instructions on uploading audio files will be emailed to competitors with the release of the program. They will be played by the theatre technician through the sound system at both the Opera House and Memorial Hall. **Competitors are to use live accompaniment or digital backing tracks, NOT CD's.**

9. Backing Tracks

A digital backing track may be used. Backing tracks must be sent to the Eisteddfod Committee prior to the commencement of competition. Competitors who answer 'yes' to the question regarding backing tracks when entering, will be notified on what is expected at least two weeks prior or once program is released, whichever comes first.

10. Cancellations / Alterations

The Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to cancel a class or to combine it with the next age group if there are fewer than three entries in that section. Prize money in any class may be lowered or not awarded if there are fewer than four entries, or if the standard of performance is not adequate (see Rule 25).



The number of places awarded in a class may also be reduced according to the number of entrants. The Eisteddfod Committee has the right to amend the program at any time, to appoint a substitute adjudicator, to divide or couple any class or award, and/or to alter competition times.

11. Choir Numbers

The number of children in school choirs (at the Memorial Hall) is 10- 50 singers. At the Opera House, choirs should consist of 10-30 singers.

12. Copyright Requirements

The Law of Copyright applies to all sections of the Music Eisteddfod. It is the responsibility of each competitor, teacher & school to adhere to the Act. Competitors are responsible for all royalty and copyright payments and liabilities (if any). Any music copied from copyright is the responsibility of the competitor and not the Eisteddfod.



All competitors are to use original or a licensed copy of their music. The **[ONE MUSIC APRA/AMCOS](#)** form is on the website for you to print out and complete prior to the event day. **Only ONE form is required per competitor/family/school.** All photocopies of music will be destroyed at the conclusion of the session.

13. Duets

If duets are to be accompanied, please specify on Adjudicator's copy of music, which instrument is the accompaniment. The names of all competitors in duets must be listed.

NEW: A competitor may perform twice in a duet class, with different partners.

14. Entrants

All entrants (including competitors and accompanists) must make themselves available for the full session (morning, afternoon or night) to allow for any necessary changes. Entrants must be ready to perform at least 15 minutes before class entered is due to commence.

15. Entries

Entries close on the closing dates and times listed. **Competitors should enter online at <http://www.comps-online.com.au>. An Administration Fee of \$5.00 will apply to each invoice issued from Comps-Online.** No entry will be accepted by any person who is or was, during the six months preceding the end of the Eisteddfod, taught or coached by the Adjudicator for that Section. A breach of this rule will result in **disqualification**. Entry fees are inclusive of copyright.



16. Gala Concert Selection

The Eisteddfod Committee selects competitors to perform at the Music and Speech & Drama Gala Concert at their own discretion with preference given to those who have placed in several classes. Performers will be selected in collaboration with the Gulgong Eisteddfod Speech & Drama Committee.

17. Item Choice

- i. Competitors must submit, to the session clerk, a copy of the sheet music to be performed for the Adjudicator. Competitors may be disqualified if they do not comply with this rule. The **exception** is the pop/ country Vocal class, where a chord chart & lyrics will be accepted.
- ii. **Competitors must clearly mark their copy of music with class number, competitor number and the title, if applicable, on the top right corner. Copy must be on A4 paper. Do not write your name. NEW: If the work is original, please add a note with "NOT SUBJECT TO COPYRIGHT".**
- iii. Entry slips will not be sent out. The Eisteddfod Committee accepts no responsibility for loss of papers. It is the responsibility of the competitor to collect original music and reports at the conclusion of the session. Photocopies of music will not be returned.
- iv. All items are OWN CHOICE; that is, there are no set works.
- v. **There are new time limits this year (see page 4).** If no time limit is stated, a **10-minute time limit** applies. **Significant overtime may be penalised.**
- vi. **Duplication of items** - No competitor may compete more than once in any solo class. The exception is where the Eisteddfod Committee has combined two classes that a particular competitor has entered. No competitor may render the same item in more than one class, except where otherwise stated. No solo or duet competitor may render the same item with which he or she has won 1st prize in the Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod in the previous year.

18. Microphones

The use of microphones is not permitted, including in the vocal section.

19. Minimum Props

Only those props required to enhance the performance are permitted. These must be able to be carried on stage quickly. Props must not obstruct passageways and must be removed from the backstage area as soon as possible after the performance. **Bands** are to bring their own equipment including music stands.

20. Novice

A novice competitor has been learning that instrument for less than 18 months, OR this is their first eisteddfod.



21. Open

Open classes have no age restriction.

22. Order of Competition

Competitors shall compete in the order in which their names appear on the official program, subject to any variation the Eisteddfod Committee may deem necessary. In **exceptional** circumstances, out of class performance may be permitted, at the discretion of the Session Convenor and the Adjudicator. The competitor may not be eligible for a place or prize at the adjudicator's discretion but will receive an adjudication report.

23. Own Risk

All competitors perform at their own risk, and the Eisteddfod Committee is unable to accept any responsibility for performers, their equipment and/or personal belongings.

24. Performance Etiquette

Good sportsmanship is expected from competitors and audience members at all times. There must be no applause, whistling, stamping of feet etc. before or during a performance. Applause and encouragement are to be reserved for the end of a performance.

25. Performance Standard

The Gulgong Eisteddfod aims for a high standard of dress, program material and presentation. Adjudicators may take these aspects into account when making their decisions.

26. Steinway Piano

The grand piano will be in a predetermined position on the stage and is not to be moved at any time during a section or session

27. Private Video Recording and Photography

It is the policy of the Gulgong Prince of Wales Eisteddfod that there is no private still photography or image recording of any performance, except by a parent in solo classes in the Music section.

28. Prizes

Senior prizes and **all** Championships will be awarded on the following scale:

One to three entries in class	1 st prize
Four to five entries in class	1 st & 2 nd prize
Six or more entries in class	1 st , 2 nd & 3 rd prize

Where classes are combined, the prizes given are those applicable for the class of the oldest competitor or highest grade. If a particular person is the sole competitor in several classes, a certificate may be the only prize awarded.



29. Prompting

No prompt or assistance of any kind may be given to any competitor, except by the Adjudicator. This includes adult conductors singing with children's choirs. No teacher or parent shall be allowed on the stage area with a competitor, other than a conductor or accompanist during a performance, unless instructed by the Adjudicator. Special Needs groups are exempt. **Disregarding this rule will result in disqualification of the competitor.**

30. Protests

Any protests must be lodged verbally to the Session Convenor within ten minutes of the Adjudicator's decision. A written explanation outlining the reasons for the protest must be submitted before the end of the Session, accompanied by a deposit of \$30.

The protest will be decided by an *ad hoc* Protest Committee of a minimum of three, comprising the Session Convenor and two or more Eisteddfod Committee members depending on availability. Their decision will be final. Should the protest be upheld, the deposit will be refunded. Verbal grievances or complaints to individual Eisteddfod Committee members or Eisteddfod volunteers are not in the spirit of Eisteddfod competition. They will not be tolerated and could lead to exclusion from any further participation in the Eisteddfod.

31. Rehearsals

Once a section has commenced, no rehearsals may be held in the Prince of Wales Opera House or the Memorial Hall. A rehearsal is defined as any form of conducted performance, or planned performance, or any part of performance that exceeds one minute. Bands are allowed one minute for tuning and sound check.

32. Responsibility of Syllabus and Program

While every care is taken in compiling the syllabus and programs, the Eisteddfod Committee will not be responsible for any omissions, alterations or errors that may occur. The entrant is responsible for ensuring their entry is correct.

33. Restricted

Restricted refers to a competitor having not won a first place in that discipline at any eisteddfod in the previous **two** years up until the closing date of entries.

34. Royalties

Entrants are responsible for any royalty payments.



35. Small School

For the purpose of the Gulgong Eisteddfod a 'small school' is defined as having a school population of up to 160 students.

36. Time Limits – See page 4

37. Upon Arrival

ALL competitors must report to the session clerk on arrival and hand in relevant Adjudicator copies of sheet music. Copies of music items are also to be handed in where numerous competitors are playing from the same book. See Rule 12 – Copyright Requirements and Rule 17 – Item Choice.

38. Venues

Music will be held at the Prince of Wales Opera House, Mayne Street, Gulgong. School Day performances, including school choirs and instrumental groups will be held at the Memorial Hall, Herbert Street, Gulgong.

Rule 8 – Audio Files

Instructions on uploading audio files will be emailed to competitors with the release of the program. They will be played by the theatre technician through the sound system at both the Opera House and Memorial Hall. **Competitors are to use live accompaniment or digital backing tracks, NOT CD's.**

Rule 9 – Backing Tracks

A digital backing track may be used. Backing tracks must be sent to the Eisteddfod Committee prior to the commencement of competition. Competitors who answer 'yes' to the question regarding backing tracks when entering, will be notified on what is expected at least two weeks prior or once program is released, whichever comes first.

Note: NO VOCALS ON BACKING TRACKS in any solo, ensemble or choir item.

Rule 11 - Choir Numbers

The number of children in school choirs (at the Memorial Hall) is 10- 50 singers. At the Opera House, choirs should consist of 10-30 singers.

Rule 17 - Item Choice

- i) Competitors must submit, to the session clerk, a copy of the sheet music to be performed for the Adjudicator.
- iv) All items are OWN CHOICE; that is, there are no set works.
- v) There is a 10-minute time limit in every class except where otherwise stated.

Rule 18 - Microphones

The use of microphones is not permitted, including in the vocal section.
