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GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the following rules and conditions may involve disqualification and the withholding of prizes. All entries are received subject to this proviso, which shall not be subject to any appeal at law as being contrary to the spirit of friendly competition upon which this Eisteddfod is based.

1. ENTRIES MUST BE LODGED BY THE CLOSING DATE.

For **2026 MUSIC and SPEECH AND DRAMA**, entries are to be submitted on the appropriate entry form and either posted to PO Box 61, NARRABRI NSW 2390 with the relevant entry fee or emailed to the relevant gmail address together with the payment receipt.

For **2026 DANCE**, entries are to be lodged and paid for online at www.compsonline.com.au. Search for 2026 Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod event. **Entry will be open from 2 February 2026.** (NB: If entries to an Item reach full capacity the relevant Section Convenor will contact you to discuss alternatives.)

2. Acceptance of an entry is **RECEIPT OF BOTH** the correct Entry Form **AND** correct payment amount **by the due date, Friday 13 March 2026, including the \$10 program fee. THIS IS NOT NEGOTIABLE.**

3. A direct deposit is the preferred payment option. Bank account details are as follows:-

A receipt for payment by direct deposit **MUST** accompany the entry form. **PLEASE NOTE:** We are unable to accept cheques.

4. All general enquiries should be addressed to the President, however, **SPECIFIC ENQUIRIES** in relation to one of the three Sections should be made to the relevant **SECTION CONVENOR**.

5. **It is the responsibility of each competitor to check the Program for a correct listing.**

6. If you contact the Section Convenor **within 7 days** notifying the Committee of a mistake in the emailed Program, we can change this for you free of charge. **After the 7 days we charge a fee of \$10 PER CHANGE to emailed official Program.**

All requests for changes and/or withdrawals should be made to the **SECTION CONVENOR AS SOON AS KNOWN**, by email or phone. **Withdrawal on the day of performance should be advised on arrival.**

7. The competitor's age is recognised as at the advertised **OPENING DATE** of the Eisteddfod, ie **25 May 2026** - and the grade the entrant is in. Competitors in sections limited to a particular age group must be prepared to submit proof of age if required to do so by the Committee.

8. Entries in Duos and Trios, in Groups and Ensembles, must be in the age group of the oldest entrant. **(The exception to this is in the Dance Section – please see specific Dance Rules.)**

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9. In the case of Poems for Two, Duos and Trios, ALL the names of the participants must be included on the **one** entry form.
10. To aid programming in Groups and Ensemble sections please differentiate between groups if more than one group is entering from the same School or Organisation in the same section, e.g. Narrabri Dance School – Group One and Narrabri Dance School - Group Two.
11. A BEGINNER will be a person who has less than 18 MONTHS experience in a particular style. Anyone who recommences study after 18 months is NO LONGER classified as a BEGINNER.
12. RESTRICTED SECTIONS are open to competitors who have not placed (that is, come 1st, 2nd or 3rd) in that style at previous Narrabri Eisteddfods. Once a competitor has placed in any given style, they are NO LONGER eligible to enter a restricted section in that style thereafter.
NOTE: If a competitor wishes to enter an unrestricted item AS WELL as a restricted item in the same genre, this is done at their own risk; if placed in the unrestricted item first, they will be disqualified from performing in the proceeding restricted item.
13. Unless stated otherwise, a competitor may perform only ONE ITEM in each section.
14. Where time limits are stated, the performance must be kept within the specified time. Time is determined from the first note/word to the last note/word. To aid programming sections with unspecified time limits, please state on the Entry Form the expected duration of each item.
15. Every consideration will be given to accommodating visiting competitors in the preparation of the program. ALL requests of this nature need to be in writing and should accompany the entry form.
16. The Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to amend the program at any time. **This includes the right to CANCEL OR COMBINE any sections** in which it is considered insufficient entries have been received. Competitors will receive early notice of cancellation. ENTRY FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED unless the item is cancelled.
17. Should the Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee be convinced that an entry has been made in the wrong category the Committee reserves the right to transfer such an entry to the correct section.
18. Entries will not be accepted from anyone who has been a pupil of the Adjudicator in the three months prior to the opening of the Eisteddfod.
19. COMMUNICATION WITH THE ADJUDICATOR by the competitors, teachers or other interested parties is strictly forbidden. COMPETITORS WILL RISK DISQUALIFICATION should this happen. All enquiries must be made through the SECTION CONVENOR.
20. The Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute Adjudicator if the appointed Adjudicator is unable to fulfill his/her duties.
21. In all sections, the award of first or any prize is at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
22. AN ADJUDICATOR'S DECISION IS FINAL. The Adjudicator reserves the right at all times to terminate a competitor's performance.

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23. ANY PROTEST OR OBJECTION must be lodged with the Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee, in writing, within 15 MINUTES of the cause of complaint and must be accompanied by a DEPOSIT OF \$30.00. If a protest is upheld, the deposit will be refunded.
24. Except in extenuating circumstances, competitors shall compete in the order in which their names appear on the official program. If they are not present when called upon, they may be slotted in when it is convenient, but they will be ADJUDICATED ONLY.
25. Deferment within a session will be at the discretion of the Adjudicator or Convenor. Approaches of this nature are to be made through the SECTION CONVENOR.
26. Adjudication sheets will be available 15 minutes after the conclusion of adjudication and it is the RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMPETITORS to collect the award sheets. No adjudication sheets will be posted.
27. The stage area and pianos **WILL NOT BE** available for rehearsal during the Eisteddfod.
28. ONLY COMPETITORS AND EISTEDDFOD OFFICIALS will be allowed backstage.
29. PROMPTING OR COACHING in any form will not be permitted, including vocal accompaniment by the conductor.
30. Props must be easily handled by one person and not affixed to any part of the building and must be promptly removed at the end of the performance. Removal of props backstage will not be permitted during a competitor's performance.
31. NO DANGEROUS PROPS are to be used, e.g. talcum powder, flames etc. NO OBJECT CAN BE THROWN FROM THE STAGE. Failure to comply with this rule will result in IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION.
32. Props and instruments are to be labeled appropriately and can be left with the stage manager 30 MINUTES prior to the beginning of each session e.g. Morning Session, Afternoon Session or Evening Session.
33. Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee takes every care, but accepts NO RESPONSIBILITY for the loss or damage to books, papers, music, instruments, USBs/iPods or any property of the Competitor. Competitors are responsible for collecting their own property at the end of each session.
34. No flash photography is allowed in the performance auditorium. **NO VIDEO PHOTOGRAPHY IS ALLOWED IN ANY DANCE SECTIONS OF THE EISTEDDFOD EXCEPT IN THE SCHOOLS' DANCE SECTION.**
35. Under no circumstances is the hall or stage lighting to be adjusted for performances.
36. Mobile phones **MUST** be switched off in the auditorium.
37. No unaccompanied children are allowed in the upstairs balcony area of the Crossing Theatre.
38. **SCHOOLS AND GROUPS ARE ASKED TO ADHERE TO ADJUDICATION TIMING IN THE PROGRAMS.** Please arrange entry and exit around these times, preferably at the completion

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of that Section, as it is appreciated that you acknowledge the Adjudications and give maximum audience to all involved. Full programs should not be interrupted by large group movement.

39. The Higher School Certificate section is included in each of the categories (Music/Dance/S&D) so that current HSC students are provided with an immeasurable opportunity to obtain a professional opinion and critique of their performance, prior to their educational assessment. Entry is offered free of charge. In this context, audience for these items will be at the discretion of the relevant Convenor.
40. The committee expects that pieces presented are within the bounds of what is generally regarded as **"good taste"**. Gratuitous violence, explicit sex or unduly offensive language would be deemed UNACCEPTABLE. The adjudicator has the prerogative to halt the performance.

COPYRIGHT GUIDELINES FOR EISTEDDFODS

MUSIC, POEM, DRAMATIC OR LITERACY EXTRACT:

"Competitors must perform from a PURCHASED ORIGINAL. Accompanists must also perform from a purchased original or a borrowed original. Adjudicators may be handed a photocopy, but it must be retained and destroyed by the Committee after the performance. Any mechanical royalties are to be paid by the performer."

The Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee holds a license from One Music Australia for the live performances of published music.

MUSIC SECTION SPECIFIC RULES AND CONDITIONS

- **For vocal items, the Adjudicator's copy needs to include lyrics and music score, not lyrics only.**
- **It is necessary to bring your own device to play a backing track.**
- **If you contact the Section Convenor within 7 days of receiving the Music Program, notifying the Committee of a mistake in the emailed Program, we can change this for you free of charge. After the 7 days there is a fee of \$10 PER CHANGE to emailed official Program.**

CLOSING DATE = Friday 13 March 2026

- M1. Competitors must perform from a **PURCHASED ORIGINAL** (sheet music, album or book) which is the responsibility of the competitor. Accompanists must also perform from a purchased or borrowed original. **NOTE:** If the piece of music is an Own Composition, then a copy of the sheet music with score and/or words is to be provided to the Convenor.

If an accompaniment part is inseparable from a solo instrument or vocal piece, a single photocopy of the accompaniment part may be made for use in an Eisteddfod performance. This single copy must be clearly marked with the words "Accompanist Copy".

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After the performance the copy of the accompanist part must be handed to the Eisteddfod organisers for collection. All these copies must be sent to One Music Australia at the conclusion of the Eisteddfod or Music Competition (please refer to Copyright paragraph).

- M2.** A photocopy of the music for the Adjudicator **MUST** be handed in to the Music Convenor no later than **30 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SESSION.**

The adjudicator's copy must be labeled with the **ITEM NUMBER, COMPETITOR NUMBER AND NAME and if applicable, TITLE OF BACKING TRACK. FOR VOCAL ITEMS,** the Adjudicator's copy needs to include **lyrics and music score**, not only lyrics.

Photocopies instead of large music books should be presented and must be in good order and clearly marked, with the title and name of the composer clearly indicated. **ORIGINALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED BY THE MUSIC CONVENOR.** (Following the Eisteddfod, the Committee will destroy these Adjudicator's copies.)

- M3.** It is necessary to bring your own device to play a backing track. If this is for a vocal item, sheet music of the chosen song **MUST** be handed in to the Music Convenor, with **lyrics and music score.**
- M4.** A competitor who has won with an item at the 2024 Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod must not compete with that item at this year's Eisteddfod.
- M5.** A FOLK OR TRADITIONAL SONG means a song that has been composed by an unknown person.
- M6.** A POPULAR SONG means a piece of music with recognized notation and published lyrics that has been in the charts over the years.
- M7.** To aid programming competitors are asked to state on the Entry Form the expected duration of each MUSICAL ITEM. (Time is determined from the first note to the last note.) **Please note the time limits as they will be strictly observed.**
- M8.** In sections where two or more people are competing in combination, a competitor may compete in MORE THAN ONE combination in the same section. (This applies to Duets, Trios and Groups.)
- M9.** In the case of Duets, Trios and Groups ALL NAMES are to be included on the **one** Entry Form and the chosen piece of music needs to include harmony lines as well as the melody.
- M10.** To ensure that no Band is inconvenienced by an incorrect stage setup, under no circumstances will a Band be allowed to set up the stage for their performance without the permission of the MUSIC CONVENOR.
- M11.** SECTIONS WILL NOT BE SPLIT to cater for competitors.
- M12.** Competitors requiring an accompanist must make their own arrangements.
- M13.** Competitors whose accompanists have work commitments that could make attendance at the Eisteddfod difficult **can request of the Music Convenor** that their items be programmed on a certain day or in a certain session. There is no guarantee, however, that this programming will be possible. (Refer also to General Rule 5.)

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- M14.** All competitors in a School Group item must attend the entrant school. ALL SCHOOLS MUST STATE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS ON THE ENTRY FORM PLEASE.
- M15.** OPEN sections are open to all competitors of any age, ADULT or JUNIOR.
- M16.** Except for Pre-School, **all school choirs** are required to perform **TWO** items. Chosen pieces can be:-
a) Any work; and a
b) Contrasting piece.
- M17.** To be eligible for the Small Schools Section, a school is to have **no more than 100 enrolled pupils**.
- M18.** Teachers may accompany a school group without jeopardizing age restrictions.
- M19.** Short pieces of less than twenty bars may be repeated ONCE.
- M20.** Sections of work are not to be repeated unless it is the final section, which repeats a section "D.C. al fine" to complete the work.
- M21.** Microphones may only be used with sections M10 "Open Vocal - Popular Song", M21 and M22 "Secondary Vocal - Popular Song for Years 7-9" and "Years 10-12".
- M22.** If entering more than one item for the same instrument, a different piece of music is to be performed for each item.

- M7** Folk or Traditional Solo - Own choice; from any country of origin; costume optional.

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- M8 Song from Stage Show or Movie - Opera, Operetta, Musical, Rock Opera, Vaudeville or Motion Picture; costume optional.
- M9 Sacred Solo - Own choice.
- M10 Popular Song - Own choice.
- M11 Song by an Australian Composer - Own choice.

Own choice; Two pieces to be chosen

- M12 19 years and under – From 3 to 12 voices.

Own choice; Two pieces to be chosen

TIME LIMIT: Ten (10) minutes ONLY. This includes setting stage, performance and clearing stage. Own choice; Two pieces to be chosen.

- M32 Primary School Choir – From 10 to 70 voices. School uniform must be worn.
Chosen pieces can be: a) Any work; and
b) Contrasting piece.
- M33 Primary School Small Choir - Maximum 35 voices. A small choir can come from a school of ANY size. School uniform must be worn. Schools can enter more than one choir in this section.
Chosen pieces can be: a) Any work; and b) a contrasting piece.
- M34 Primary School Musical Entertainment - Choral, vocal, instrumental OR any combination of these. May be performed with props and /or costumes. From 10 to 70 performers.
- M34A Primary School Percussion Band – From 10 to 70 performers.

PRIMARY (STAGES 2 & 3) VOCAL SECTION - SOLO / DUET

- M35 Vocal Solo - Years 3 & 4. Own choice.

- M47 Infants Choir - School uniform MUST be worn; from 10 to 70 voices.
Chosen pieces can be: a) Any song; and
b) Hymn, Sacred song or a contrasting song.
- M48 Musical Entertainment - Choral, vocal, instrumental OR any combination of these; may be performed with props and /or costumes; from 10 to 70 performers.
- M48A Infants Percussion Band - Two contrasting pieces.

INFANTS (EARLY STAGE 1 and STAGE 1) VOCAL SECTION - SOLO

Fee - \$10 per person

- M49 Vocal Solo – Preschool to Kindergarten; Own choice.
- M50 Vocal Solo – Years 1 & 2. Own choice.
- M51 Folk or Traditional Solo - Year 2 & under
- M52 Sacred Solo - Year 2 & under
- M53 Song from an Australian Composer - Year 2 & under
- M54 Song in Costume - Year 2 & under

- D4.** School groups competing in the School Dance Section must come from Educational Institutions.
- D5.** In the case of Duos and Trios, **ALL NAMES** must be placed on the one entry form. If entering a Group item, the number and age of competitors need only be recorded – exception being a School Dance Group item when total number in group is required. **PLEASE ENSURE THAT THIS RULE IS ADHERED TO AS IT MAKES PROGRAMMING EASIER.**
- D6.** No competitor can perform **TWO SOLO** routines in the one item. For those students who have two routines in the SAME GENRE - one may be danced in their age section and the other in an older age item.
- D7.** In sections where two or more people are competing in combination, a competitor may compete in MORE THAN ONE COMBINATION in the same section. This applies to Duos, Trios and Groups.
- D8.** In the Group Sections, there must be at least four (4) members - but no more than 25. The age section in which the group is to compete is worked out according to the age of the oldest member. **In each group there may be one member who is up to six months older than the stated age limit.** The exception is in the School Dance Section where it is worked out according to the grades the students are in.
- D9.** In the relevant sections, Pointe shoes can **ONLY** be worn by competitors who are competent in pointe shoes. Flat ballet shoes are otherwise acceptable.
- D10.** Allcomer Sections are open to Dance teachers, Dance School owners and Student teachers.
- D11.** Open Sections are NOT open to Allcomers. However, Open Sections ARE open to Student teachers. Children may enter Open Sections but the work must be of a suitable standard.
- D12.** RESTRICTED SECTIONS are open to competitors who have not placed (that is, come 1st, 2nd or 3rd) in that style at previous Narrabri Eisteddfods. Once a competitor has placed in any given style, they are NO LONGER eligible to enter a restricted section in that style thereafter. If performers want to perform the same item in the Restricted section AND the Unrestricted section, they will only be eligible to perform in an older age item in the Unrestricted section.
- D13.** SECTIONS WILL NOT BE SPLIT to cater for the competitor.
- D14.** The use of rosin is at the stage manager's discretion.

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- D15.** Competitors must be prepared to furnish PROOF OF AGE.
- D16.** Competitors may perform THE SAME ROUTINE in more than one section where appropriate. (For example, a student choreography routine performed by two students may also be entered in the age appropriate due/trio section, for the given style.).
- D17.** It is recommended that Classical routines be carried out in a tu-tu being of a romantic or short style tu-tu.
- D18.** **Due to Child Protection Laws** and in a bid to protect choreography, no photography is allowed in the performance auditorium. **NO VIDEO PHOTOGRAPHY IS ALLOWED IN THE DANCE SECTIONS OF THE EISTEDDFOD, UNLESS BY PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE DANCE CONVENORS, EXCEPT IN THE SCHOOLS' DANCE SECTION.**
- D19.** All demi/character routine/other style of dance/national character entries must be named in the Entry Form.
- D20.** No trailers will be allowed.

- S1. Printed copies of **ALL** poems, plays, prose etc., with item number, competitor's number and name clearly displayed, are to be **handed to the DRAMA CONVENOR at least 30 MINUTES prior to the start of a session.** Failure to do so could lead to disqualification. (This is at the discretion of the Narrabri Arts Eisteddfod Committee.) **PLEASE DOUBLE CHECK THAT THE CORRECT PIECE IS SUBMITTED FOR THE CORRECT ENTRANT. Copies of chosen works are NOT to be emailed to the Convenor.**
- S2. Teachers must not sing, speak or accompany the groups they are conducting. Failure to observe this rule could result in disqualification. No teacher, except in the capacity of a conductor, will be allowed on stage at any time his or her pupils are performing.
- S3. To aid programming competitors are asked to state on the Entry Form the expected duration of each item. **Time limits will be strictly observed.** In relation to this, a bell will be sounded ONCE 15 seconds before the time limit has elapsed; a second bell AT THE TIME LIMIT and a CONTINUOUS bell at 30 seconds over the time limit. Penalties may apply for going over the time limit specified.
- S4. As the Bible version is set by the Adjudicator, entrants in the Bible reading section DO NOT NEED to bring a copy for the Adjudicator.
- S5. "Own Composition" must be the work of the competitor. It will be judged on the composition of the piece, not the performance alone. Memorisation is optional.
- S6. Sections will not be split to cater for Competitors.
- S7. "**Open**" sections are open to all competitors of any age, ADULT OR JUNIOR.
- S8. RESTRICTED SECTIONS are open to competitors who have not placed (that is, come 1st, 2nd or 3rd) in that style at previous Narrabri Eisteddfods. Once a competitor has placed in any given style, they are NO LONGER eligible to enter a restricted section in that style thereafter. **NOTE:** If a competitor wishes to enter an unrestricted item AS WELL as a restricted item in the same genre, this is done at their own risk; if placed in an unrestricted item first, they will be disqualified from performing in the proceeding restricted item.
- S9. All mimes (solos and groups) are to be performed in **BLACK WITH NO SHOES.** No costumes should be worn or props used (with the exception of chairs for seats). **Mime titles** must be supplied to the **DRAMA CONVENOR** prior to the beginning of the session and **displayed** at the beginning of the mime on a large piece of cardboard in black and white lettering for the audience to read.

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- S10.** In the case of Poems for Two, **ALL** the names of the participants must be included on the one entry form; the poetry piece must have clear identification of TWO characters; and should include several lines spoken in unison. **No costumes are to be worn, however, up to 2 props per person is allowable.**
- S11.** Except for Own Composition and Public Speaking, poetry pieces must be memorised.
- S12.** School Group Speech may consist of a maximum of 60 students.
- S13.** **“Higher School Certificate (HSC) Drama”** items will be Adjudicated **only**, to provide professional and constructive advice to the students.
- S14.** The committee expects that pieces presented are within the bounds of what is generally regarded as **“good taste”**. Gratuitous violence, explicit sex or unduly offensive language would be deemed UNACCEPTABLE. The adjudicator has the prerogative to halt the performance.
- S15.** Costumes are **not** to be worn for the poetry items, however, **up to 2 props** is allowable.
