RULES AND CONDITIONS – FOR ALL SECTIONS

- ❖ By entering the Goondiwindi Apex Eisteddfod, you agree to abide by the rules and conditions as outlined in the 2026 schedule

Entry Forms

- ❖ All entries and payments are through Comps on Line. <https://www.comps-online.com.au>
- ❖ In duet sections, the name of BOTH performers MUST be nominated on the entry form. The words 'and partner' will not be accepted
- ❖ Performers may enter in only one section in duets/duos and trios etc There can be no doubling up of entries
- ❖ If you are 18 years of age or under, date of birth MUST be provided or entry will not be accepted

Age

- ❖ The age of the performer shall be as at **1st January 2026**
- ❖ Performers in an open section may be of any age

Material

- ❖ Correctly labelled material (Instrumental, Piano, Vocal & Choir music, and Speech & Drama pieces) should be posted to The Secretary PO Box 1018 Goondiwindi 4390 by Friday 18th July
- ❖ Photocopies of Music, Poetry & Prose should be clearly labelled with: PERFORMER'S NAME & NUMBER, DIVISION NO, SECTION NO (in that order) written across the top of page (A4) size, with AMCOS form attached (See Copyright Laws)
- ❖ Material that is not correctly labeled will not be accepted
- ❖ All sections are Own Choice unless otherwise specified and must have appropriate AMCOS form attached
- ❖ If the music has been changed in any way, the changes must be marked on the adjudicator's copy
- ❖ No material may be performed in more than one section by the same performer
- ❖ Elocutionary material is preferred typed but legible handwriting is acceptable

Withdrawals

- ❖ Performers should advise the Secretary or backstage official if withdrawing from a section of competition before the start of the relevant session
- ❖ There will be no refund of entry fee
- ❖ Withdrawals may **only** be made by a parent or teacher and not by the performer if the performer is under 18 years of age

Copyright Laws

- ❖ Performers must perform from an officially published or original piece, or a licensed AMCOS copy accompanied by Form No. 1 (see AMCOS Documents - Page 7)
- ❖ If using a photocopy, Form No. 2 (see AMCOS Documents - Page 7) must be attached
- ❖ Photocopies (unless an authorised copy) submitted to the Committee will be destroyed after the Eisteddfod
- ❖ If in doubt, please consult AMCOS' *Music Copyright for Eisteddfods. For music, speech, drama & dance competitions. First edition 2006*.
- ❖ Photocopied accompaniments must be marked "Accompanist Copy", and handed to the committee after the Eisteddfod
- ❖ The Goondiwindi Apex Eisteddfod Committee is not responsible for any infringement of copyright or royalty by individual performers or those associated with the performances, who use copied material at their own risk

Accompanist

- ❖ Performers may use their own accompanist

Performance

- ❖ No pre-hearing will occur
- ❖ No substitutions will be permitted in solo sections

- ❖ Substitutions of one performer ONLY will be permitted in duets, trios or quartets
- ❖ A performer may not perform more than once in the same section except when in groups of five or more
- ❖ Performers should appear in appropriate attire for the item being performed
- ❖ Teachers are NOT PERMITTED to assist the performer except as an accompanist or a conductor or at the discretion of the Committee. Prompting is by the adjudicator only. There is to be no prompting or conducting from the audience by teachers or parents
- ❖ Page turners are permitted
- ❖ Accompaniment may be by any appropriate instrument, but the provision of alternative instruments is the sole responsibility of the performer.
- ❖ Parents and teachers are not permitted onto the stage once the performance has begun, unless as an accompanist or conductor.
- ❖ A responsible adult, other than conductors and accompanists, must be provided by schools to supervise school aged children
- ❖ Speech & Drama material, except for Scripture readings, must be memorised and performed without the aid of prompt sheets, palm cards, smart phones or hidden scripts in hand props
- ❖ The Eisteddfod committee reserves the right to photograph, record, film, broadcast, videotape or post on our website or Facebook page any item or section of the Eisteddfod. Photographs may be published by the official photographer or the eisteddfod committee. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office must be notified in writing prior to the commencement of the eisteddfod.

Adjudication

- ❖ Prompting, **EXCEPT** by the adjudicator, will not be permitted in any section
- ❖ Communication with the adjudicator by teachers, parents or performers during the competition is **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN**
- ❖ The adjudicator may with-hold or divide prizes according to merit
- ❖ The adjudicator's decision is final unless an error of identity occurs
- ❖ Adjudicator's report sheets will be available to all performers from the foyer at the end of each session

Powers of Committee

- ❖ The Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute adjudicator, or accompanist should this become necessary
- ❖ The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry
- ❖ The Committee reserves the right to amend or alter the program or to combine the age groups if there are insufficient entries
- ❖ The Committee reserves the right to change the date/venue if considered necessary
- ❖ The Committee shall always have full control of the program

Protests

- ❖ All protests must be delivered in writing to the committee before the commencement of the adjudication of the relevant section

Trophies

- ❖ Perpetual trophies are retained by the committee at the conclusion of their presentation. The committee is responsible for updating the engraving.

Auditorium Rules

- ❖ Flash cameras are **NOT TO BE USED** during performances. Please be aware of privacy issues when photographing, filming or videoing individual and group performances. It is advisable to ask the permission of teachers and/or parents before doing so
- ❖ Mobile phones and pagers must be turned off or to silent setting
- ❖ Emergency Phones may be switched to vibrate setting
- ❖ Members of the audience may not enter/exit auditorium during a performance when the venue doors are closed
- ❖ Young children must be kept under control always or taken outside

Dance

- ❖ **All music will now be uploaded. More information on where once entries close. You will be advised of the date you can commence uploading as soon as available.**

- ❖ Time limit is strictly 3 minutes except for the 18 years & under groups and Open groups which is 5 minutes. The performance may be less than the time limit but must not exceed it
- ❖ **In solos, each performer may only dance/enter in their own age division and not in older age divisions as well.**
- ❖ Because of time restraints, only 350 entries (ie that is entries, not entrants) can be accepted
- ❖ All competitors are required to register at the marshalling area at least 10 minutes before their section begins. If you are not in the marshalling area when you are due to perform, your name and performance will be withdrawn from the program
- ❖ No routine is to be performed more than once
- ❖ **Due to lack of space, only officials, community volunteers, committee members and performers are permitted backstage or in the wings during performances**
- ❖ Competitors must dance as in the order in the program to avoid music selection confusion with the sound technician. Changes in order will not be accepted
- ❖ Names, not numbers, will be announced at the introduction, for the benefit of the sound technician
- ❖ Please note – the Tap division is at the very end of the program and not performed during the other age group divisions

Instrumental

- ❖ Any other instrument – instrument **MUST** be specified on entry form and must be supplied by performer (except for percussion where a drum kit will be available)
- ❖ In duet sections the names of both performers **MUST** be nominated on the entry form. The words 'and partner' will not be accepted. For trios and quartets, school names or performance names will be accepted
- ❖ At least one performer in the duet, trio or quartet must belong to the correct age group. The others may be younger
- ❖ In Instrumental Ensembles, vocalist is allowed if indicated in the score and **may** be amplified
- ❖ Instruments must be tuned prior to performance. Minor adjustments only will be permitted on stage
- ❖ Lyrics and chords are not acceptable. Musical notation must be submitted

Speech and Drama

- ❖ Elocutionary material is preferred typed but legible handwriting is accepted
- ❖ Label material with PERFORMERS NAME & NO DIVISION NO SECTION NO
- ❖ Other than Scripture and Impromptu, all Speech and Drama pieces, **must** be memorised and performed without the aid of prompt sheets, palm cards, smart phones or hidden scripts in hand props

Vocal and Choral :4 minute time limit

- ❖ A choir may perform only once in a section but a sub section of the choir may perform in the same section
- ❖ **Please Note: All backing tracks for VOCAL will now be uploaded. More information on where once entries close. You will be advised of the date you can commence uploading as soon as available.**
- ❖ **Supporting vocals are not allowed.**
- ❖ No amplification is to be used except in sections already mentioned (see Instrumental)
- ❖ Microphones for vocal sections are **not** permitted
- ❖ Please edit long instrumental sections from backing tracks if possible.
- ❖ Vocal duets **MUST** have harmony.
- ❖ 'Own choice' material (content and presentation) must be suitable to be performed at an eisteddfod. Careful consideration should be given to the use of language that could be offensive.
- ❖ Please see definition of Sacred song on following page.

Definitions

- ❖ **Modern:** Not to be presented in Music Theatre Style. A vocal piece composed within the contemporary era, typically reflecting current musical styles.
- ❖ **Folk Song** Traditional strophic (same music repeated for each verse) song with a simple accompaniment, by an anonymous or unknown composer.
- ❖ **Art Song** A serious song by a recognized classical composer. The song should be in through-composed style or verses with varying accompaniment.
- ❖ **Golden Voice** Performer is or over the age of 50 years.
- ❖ **Music Theatre** From a Musical, Stage or Film.
- ❖ **Sacred Song.** A song with sacred text (and music preferably written in a classical style).
- ❖ **Just for Fun** Costumes are not necessary however some kind of 'uniform' to look similar or coordinated is desired. Simple movement is permitted if desired.
